TOURIST GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

ECONOMIC CONTEXT (SHCP)

International

During the third quarter of 2020, the world economy continued to recover some of the losses recorded after the largest economic contraction in the last hundred years. The easing of containment measures from May and June allowed a better rebound than expected in economic activity, which continued during the third quarter but with less dynamism. In line with signs of a sustained recovery during the third quarter, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) anticipates a smaller contraction of the world economy in 2020, compared to the level expected in June, adjusting growth from -4.9% to -4.4%.

For the advanced economies, as of September 2020, seasonally adjusted retail sales in the United States (US), the euro area and Japan returned to the levels observed prior to the COVID-19 pandemic; however, in terms of industrial activity, The latest available information indicates that these countries have not fully recovered. In terms of labour market performance, in the US, the unemployment rate with seasonal adjustment continued to show a decreasing trend while in the euro area this rate increased due to an upturn in the number of infections in the region.

In emerging economies, the economic recovery was reflected by improved foreign capital flows, appreciation in exchange rates against the US dollar and an increase in international commodity prices, mainly from oil. Also, in the financial field, during the third quarter the main variables at the global level showed better performances compared to the levels observed the previous quarter, mainly associated with the existence of positive expectations related to the pace of economic recovery, as well as to the accommodative state of monetary policy in the world.

National

In the case of Mexico, as the National Day of Sana Distancia came to an end on May 31, various sectors of the economy resumed activities in a gradual, orderly and under strict sanitary protocols. In the first instance, mining, construction and manufacturing of transport equipment were added to the core activities during the month of June, which together account for approximately 56.1% of GDP and absorb just over 60% of the employed population.

Subsequently, as a favourable change in the trend in the number of new COVID-19 infections was observed during the third quarter, more industries were integrated into the list of core activities, This was followed by increased mobility of people and increases in economic activity and employment.

Thus, the information available for the third quarter of the year suggests that the Mexican economy has begun to recover after reaching its lowest point in April and May. This is seen in the 12.0% increase in the timely estimate of GDP in the third quarter of 2020 compared to the previous quarter, with seasonally adjusted data. Within GDP, primary, secondary and tertiary activities grew by 7.4%, 22.0%, and 8.6%, respectively, compared to the figures observed in the previous quarter.

On the labour market, between May and September, 7.8 million jobs were recovered, particularly in the construction (+1.5 million), manufacturing, extractive and electricity industries (+1.5 million) and trade (+2.7 million). This represents a 62.7% recovery from the number of jobs lost between March and April.
