




ARRIVAL OF INTERNATIONAL VISITORS










AVERAGE EXPENDITURE OF LONG-STAY TOURISTS, AIR TRANSPORT






DEPARTURES OF INTERNATIONAL TOURISTS FROM MEXICO














INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY NATIONALITY)

Chart 8. During January-February 2020 United States citizens's arrivals by air stands out, representing 50.7% of total, from Canada was 20.3%, while the European region had an 11.0% participation in total, corresponding 1.9% to French citizens, South America region represented 10.8% of total, Colombia and Brazil citizens participated with 2.7% and 2.0% of total, in same period.








INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY RESIDENCE)






U.S CITIZENS BY AIRPORT































Figure 2. In January-February 2020 the ports that received the highest number of passengers were the



ECONOMIC CONTEXT

International

During the first months of 2020, the world economic environment has undergone important changes as a result of the emergence of the epidemic outbreak called COVID-19 and its transformation into a global pandemic.

In addition to the loss of human life, the pandemic has generated important public health challenges in various countries. The sanitary measures necessary to mitigate it have had important repercussions on economic activity, mainly in the affected countries, although their effect has spread to all countries through the prices of raw materials, financial markets, lower world demand and the uncertainty about the effects it will have on global growth.

With the rapid spread of COVID-19, notable episodes of volatility have been observed in international financial markets, triggering greater risk aversion and an increase in the demand for safe assets.

By 2020, the greater uncertainty and the prospects of less growth as a result of the spread of COVID-19, led to a drop in oil prices.

In this context, the projections of global economic activity have been subject to a constant downward revision in a very short time.

National

In 2020 the Mexican economy faces a more adverse environment due to the spread of COVID-19 and the collateral effects that the measures applied by the different countries to contain its transmission will have on the global economy and on the Mexican economy.

The oil price war, started on March 7, between Russia and Saudi Arabia, represents an aggravating factor in the current context. Although the balance of risks for the growth of the Mexican economy this year is biased downward, our country has robust macroeconomic fundamentals, as well as safeguards and various public policy options to face an adverse scenario in 2020.

During 2020, the peso registered a pronounced depreciation mainly due to the increase in risk aversion due to the environment generated by the outbreak of COVID-19 outside China and the oil price war, the potential consequences of which generated concerns for investors.
