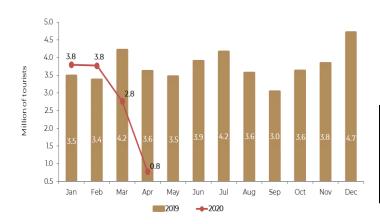

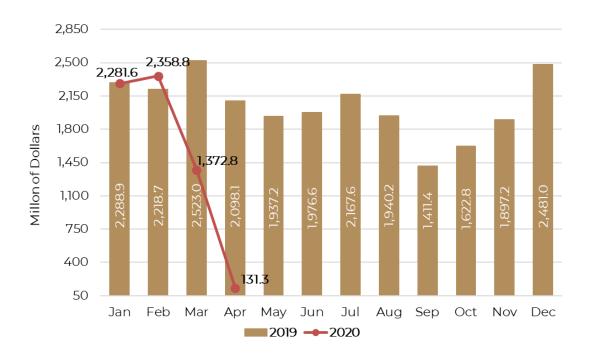

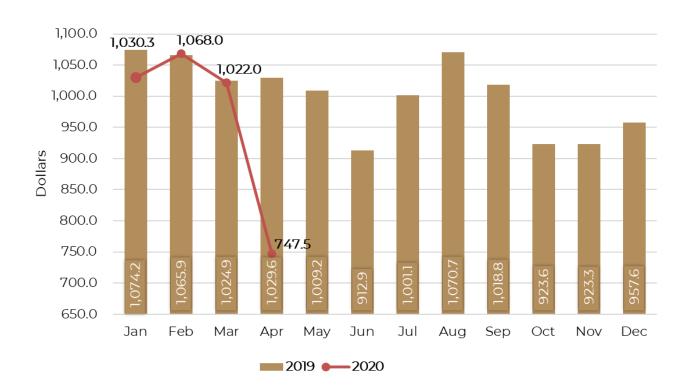




AVERAGE EXPENDITURE OF LONG-STAY TOURISTS, AIR TRANSPORT

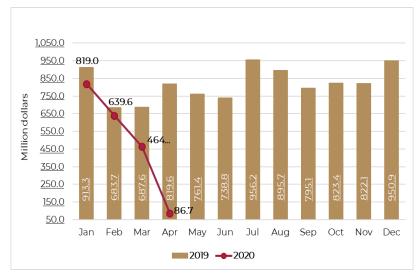

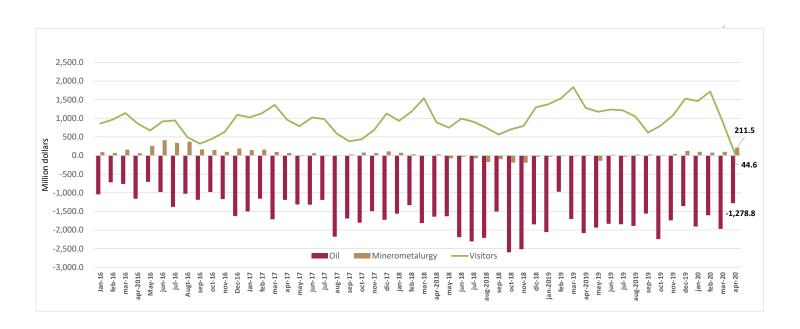

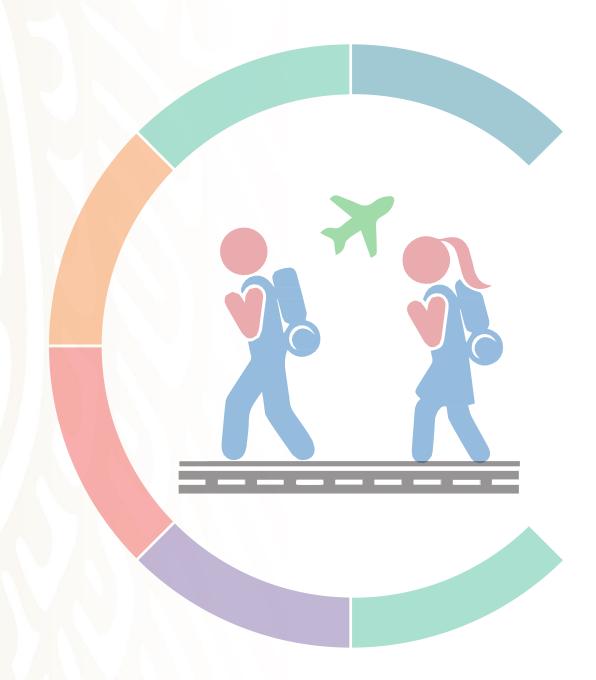
BALANCE OF OIL AND INTERNATIONAL TRAVELLERS

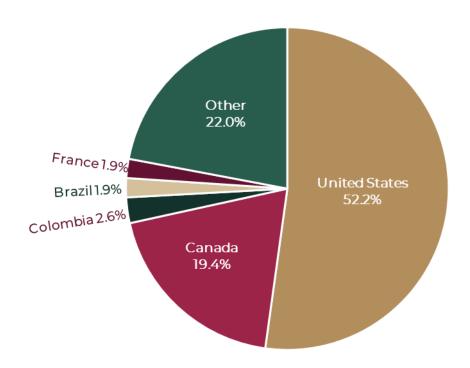






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY NATIONALITY)

Chart 8. During January-April 2020 United States citizens's arrivals by air stands out, representing 52.2% of total, from Canada was 19.4%, while the European region had an 11.0% participation in total, corresponding 1.9% to French citizens, South America region represented 10.4% of total, Colombia and Brazil citizens participated with 2.6% and 1.9% of total, in same period.

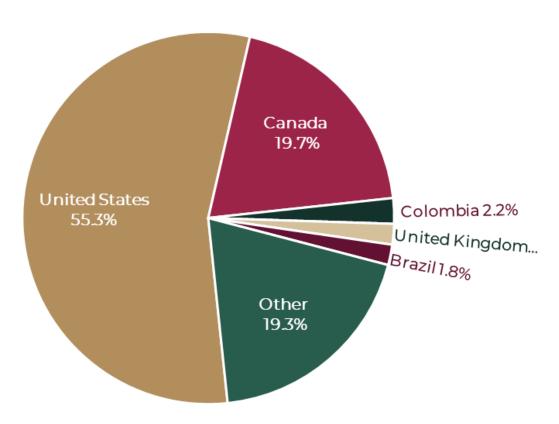






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY RESIDENCE)

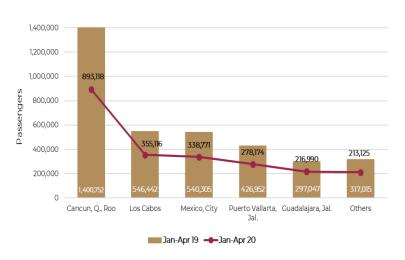




U.S CITIZENS BY AIRPORT

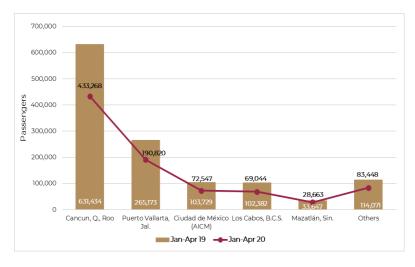

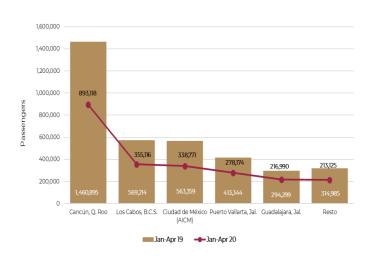


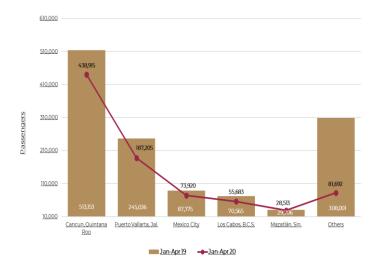

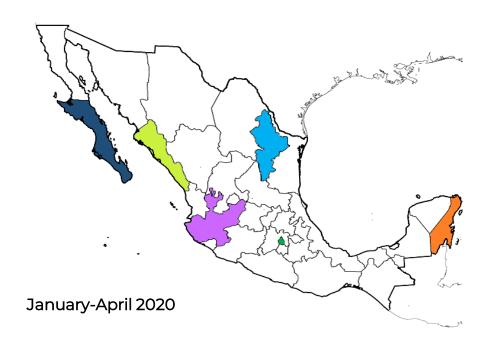

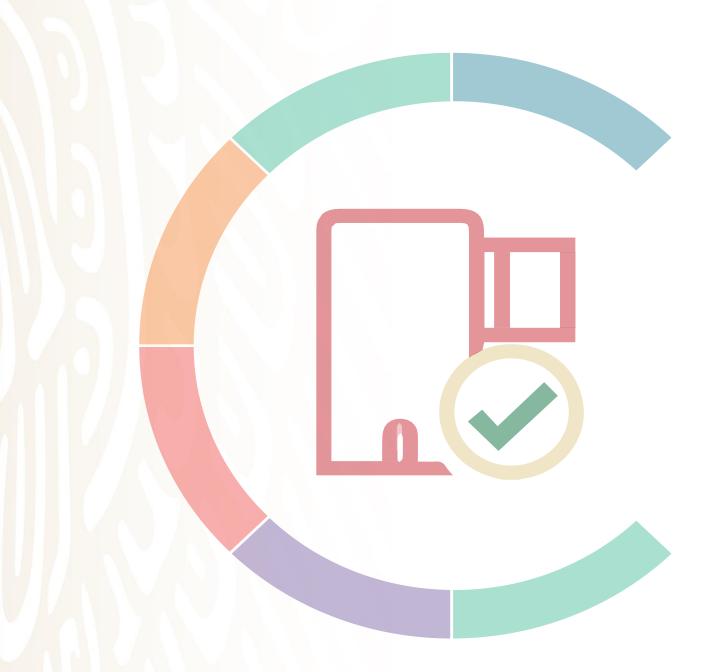

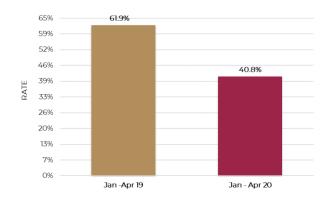
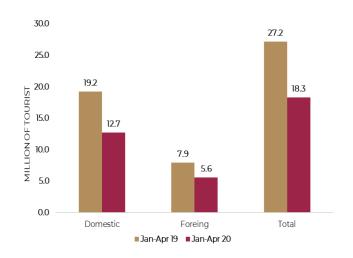

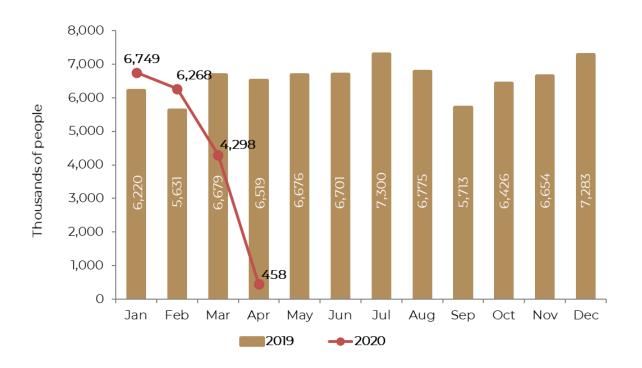

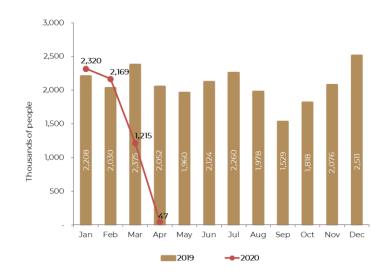

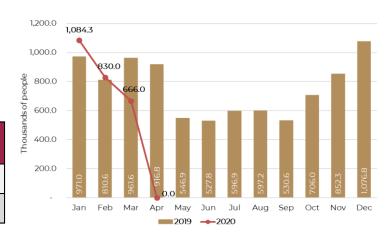

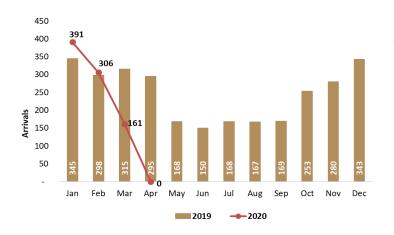

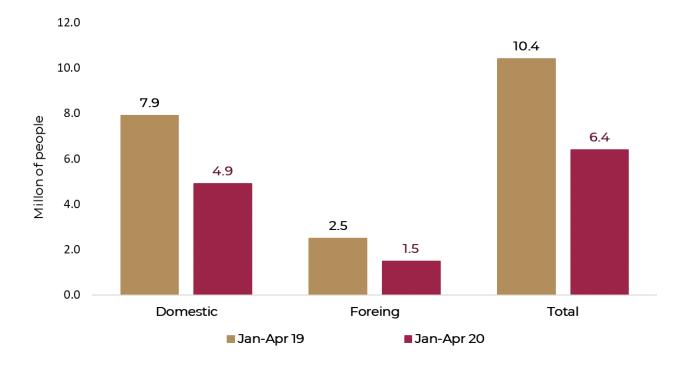

ECONOMIC CONTEXT

International

The COVID-19 pandemic and the measures taken to prevent its spread have significantly affected global economic activity. In this context, the confidence of economic agents decreased. The disruption of global production chains and the fall in consumption and investment contributed to the above. The production stoppages affect the most open and integrated economies to global value chains more strongly, due to the fact that the different phases of the pandemic make it difficult to synchronize production, and to regions dependent on tourism.

The external demand faced by the economies has been affected by this, while the internal demand has suffered from the lower incomes of households and companies, which, together with confinement actions, has reduced spending. All of the above is leading to a significant drop in employment, which will widen the economic contraction.

There are strong contractions in economic activity in the euro area and in the United States, the most worrying figure being the unemployment rate in the United States, which exceeded 14% in April. Although industrial production in China decreased in February, it showed some recovery in March.

The described environment has led to unprecedented downward revisions in recent decades in economic expectations, which incorporate a strong contraction in 2020. For the second quarter of 2020, the most pronounced contraction in global GDP is expected in this episode.

National

The timely information shows that the economic activity in Mexico had a significant contraction in the first quarter of the year, which already incorporates effects associated with the pandemic. The Mexican economy was already weak since before the pandemic. According to the timely estimate of GDP for the first quarter of the year, this decreased 1.55% compared to the previous quarter, this being the largest drop since the financial crisis of 2008-2009. This contraction reflects the impact of isolation measures, the slowdown in external demand and disruption in value chains.

Confinement measures have affected aggregate demand, and various indicators point to a contraction in consumption and investment in March and April 2020. Exports decreased, including automotive ones, while imports maintained their negative trend.

On the supply side, several indicators suggest a contraction in services and in the industrial sector.
