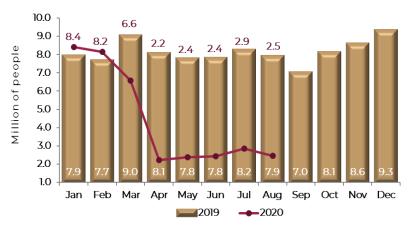

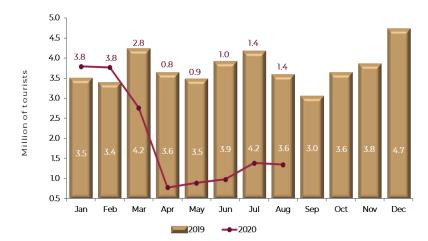

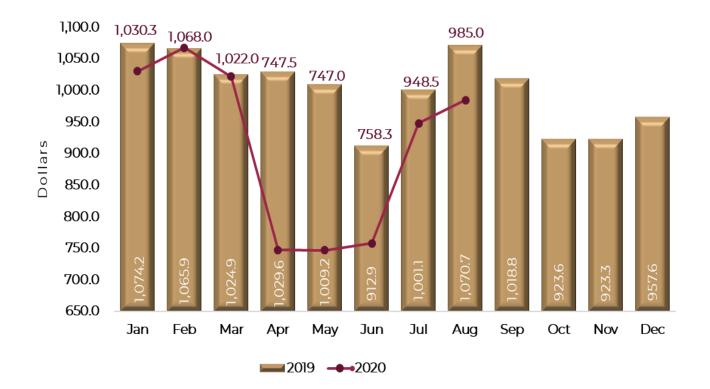

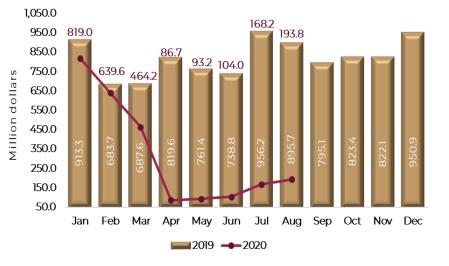

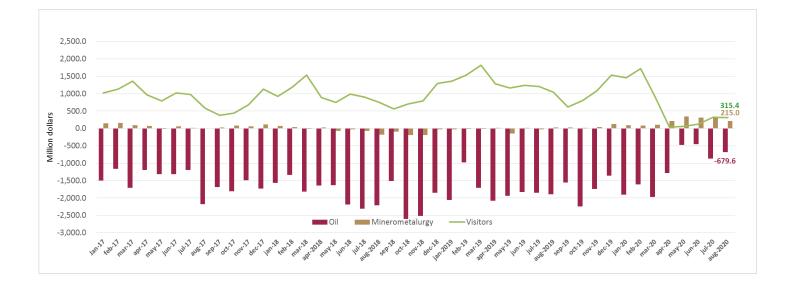

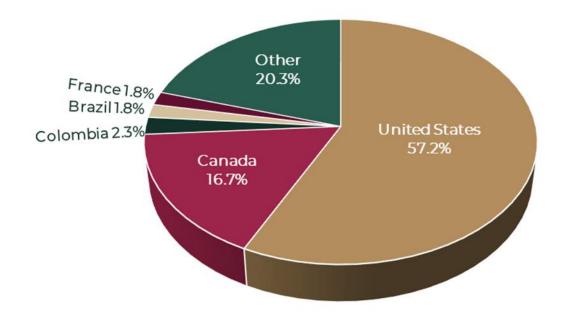






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY NATIONALITY)

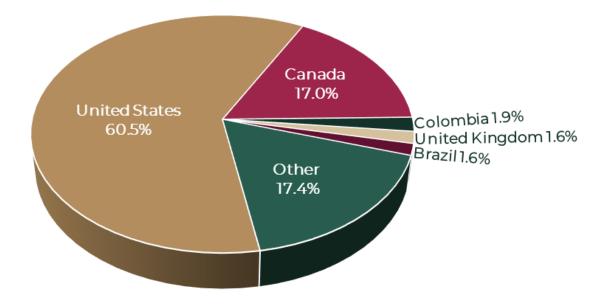






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY RESIDENCE)

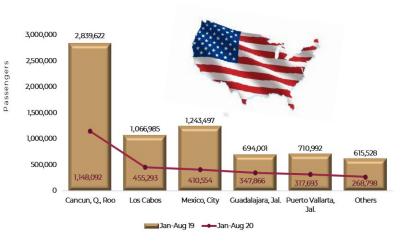

CANADIAN CITIZENS BY AIRPORT

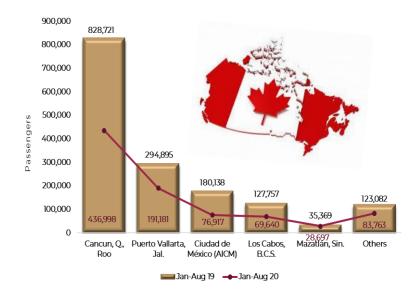

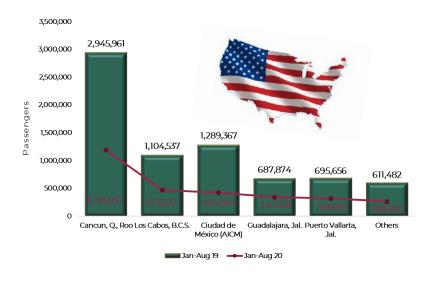


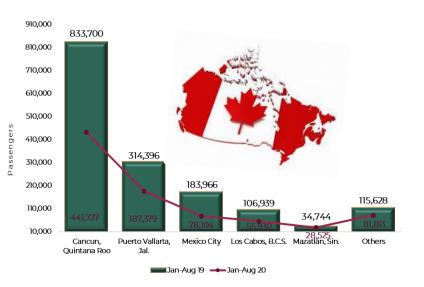

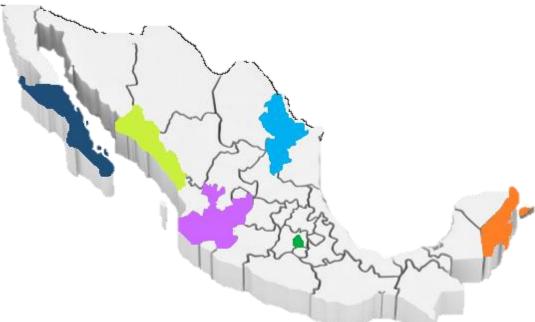

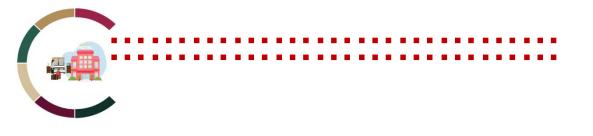

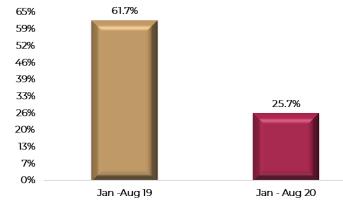
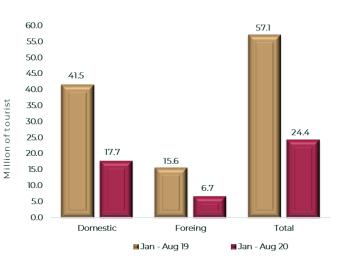

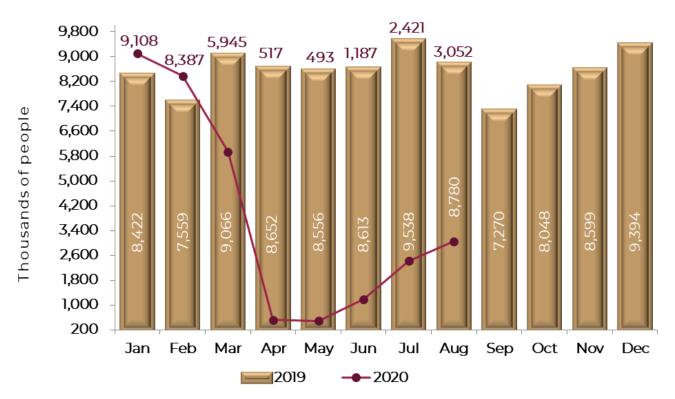

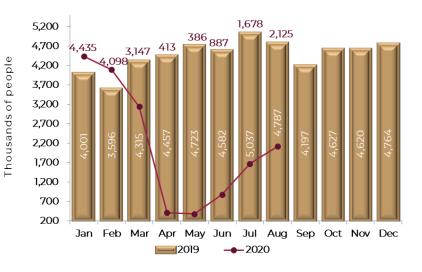

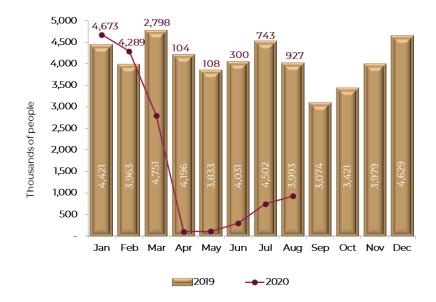

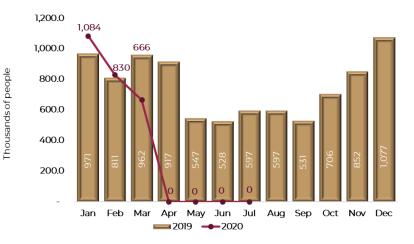

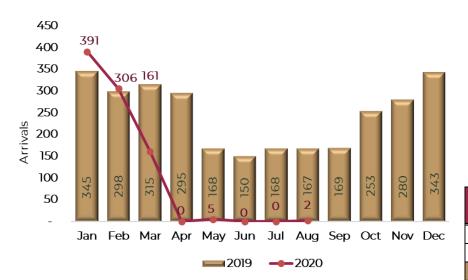

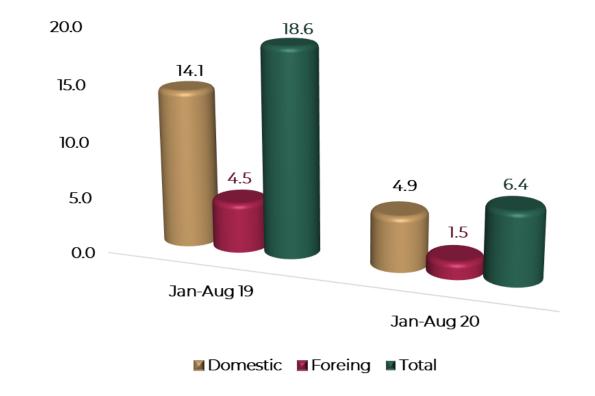

OTHER INDICATORS AND ANALYSIS OF INTERNATIONAL TOURISM





ECONOMIC CONTEXT (SHCP)

International

At the beginning of 2020, global perspectives on trade showed greater optimism due to the multiple trade agreements reached between several countries, among which the "phase one" trade agreement between the United States and China, and the ratification of the Treaty between Mexico, the United States and Canada (T-MEC). However, although the development of the COVID-19 pandemic also contributed to a relaxation in global trade tensions, some of these tensions were rekindled during the month of June.

The entry into force of the T-MEC on 1 July 2020 introduced greater certainty in trade policy in the North American region. For its part, in Europe, trade tensions could be observed between the United Kingdom and the European Union if a trade agreement is not reached in the context of Brexit. In fact, during the second quarter of 2020, geopolitical conflicts rebounded amid the health crisis. While these conflicts have been intermittent and have not been of persistent intensity, they constitute risk factors that may re-emerge or accentuate during the year.

Announcements and implementation of expansionary fiscal and monetary policy measures along with financial system support measures improved the expectation of global economic recovery and reduced uncertainty about financial stability. Global financial conditions also improved and volatility in financial markets was reduced since March 2020 when levels were reached that had not been observed since 2008. On the other hand, there was a partial recovery in the appetite for assets in emerging markets and a reduction in risk premiums; however, these still maintain high levels compared to the first months of 2020

National

In order to address the macroeconomic shock caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and some of the distortions resulting from it, Mexico's financial authorities have implemented a wide range of measures. The measures have sought to ensure that the financial system continues to fulfil its role of intermediation of resources, encouraging the continuous flow of financing to the economy and encouraging the orderly behavior of the financial markets. The following is a summary of the main measures taken by the Mexican financial authorities to preserve financial stability.

Domestically, Mexico faces the risk of a decline in its sovereign debt rating and of Pemex, mainly because of its low rate of economic growth and in particular by the weakening of the investment and risk represented by Pemex's contingent liabilities.

It should be noted that in the wake of the pandemic, the financial authorities in Mexico have taken a wide range of measures to mitigate its impact on the economy and maintain the proper operation of the financial system. In particular, measures were announced to promote the orderly functioning of financial markets, strengthen credit channels, mainly for small and medium-sized enterprises, and provide liquidity to promote the stability and functioning of the financial system.

In addition, all the financial authorities have taken operational continuity measures which, inter alia, facilitate the deadlines for the provision of information by the regulated institutions.

In this context, with regard to the Mexican banking system, the analysis of credit, market and liquidity risks highlights that in general the bank shows a solid position, with sufficient capital and reasonable levels of liquidity. In addition, other financial intermediaries such as brokers, entities in the insurance and bonding sectors, retirement savings, as well as investment funds, development banks, promotion agencies and other non-banking intermediaries, In general, they maintain limited levels of risk.
