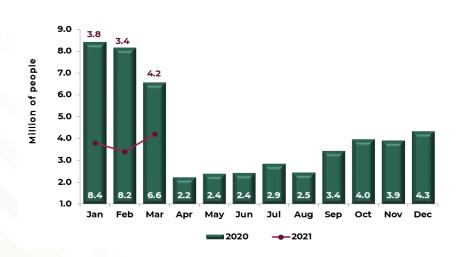

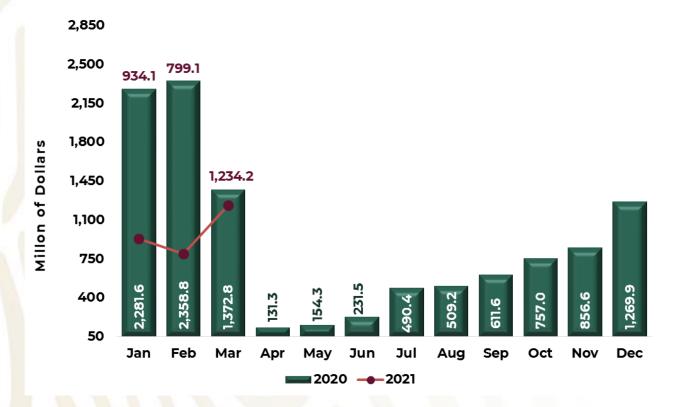

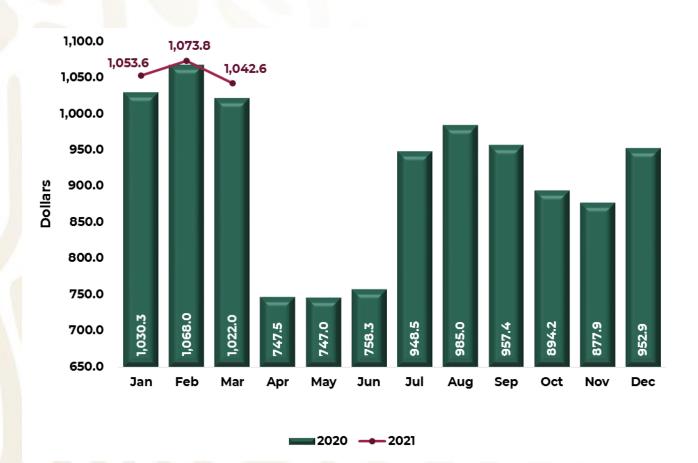

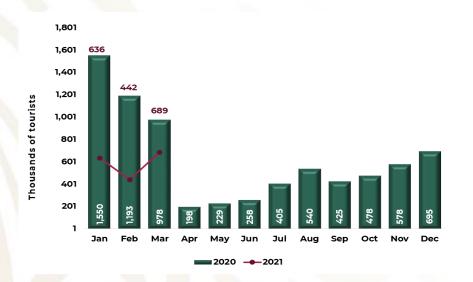

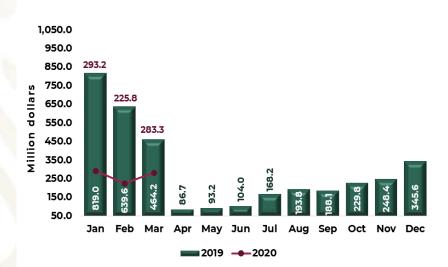

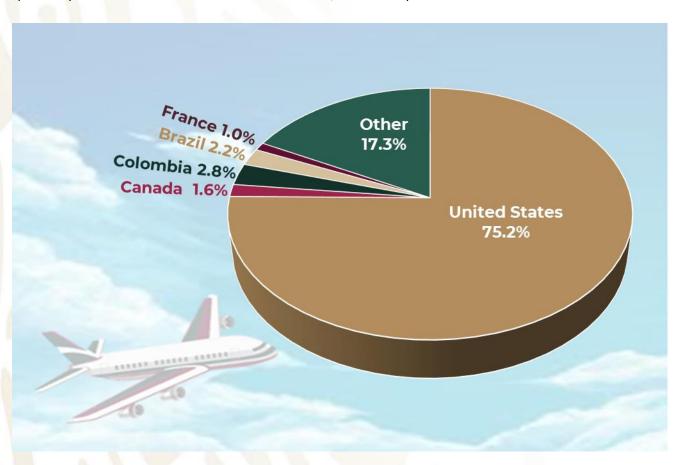






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY NATIONALITY)

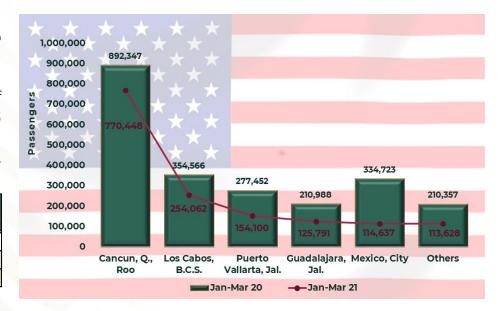




U.S CITIZENS BY AIRPORT

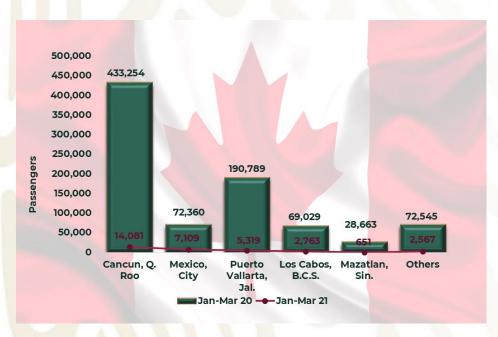

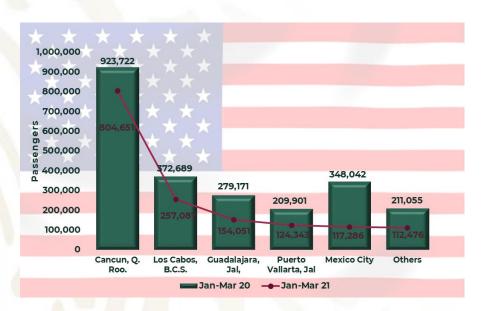


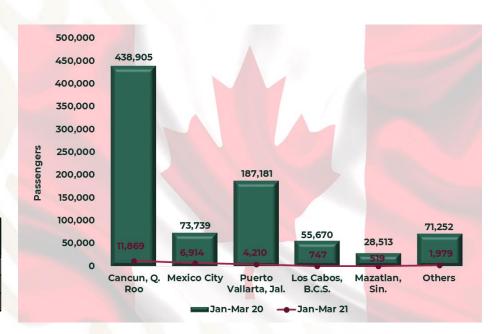

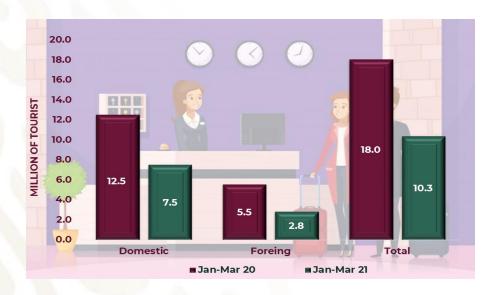
OCCUPANCY RATE

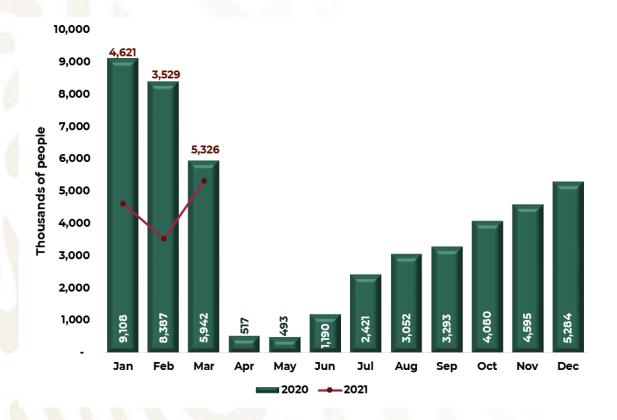

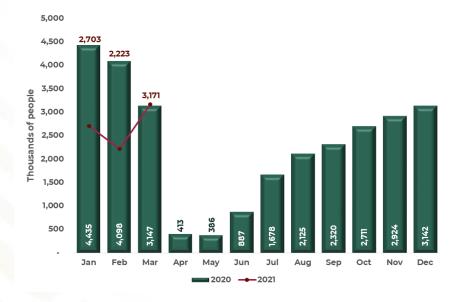

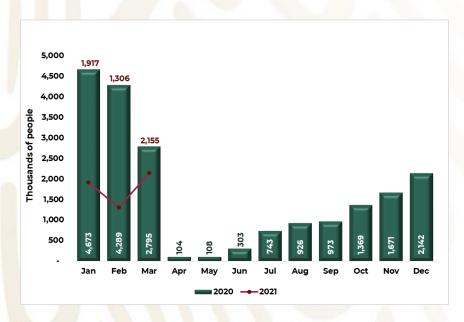

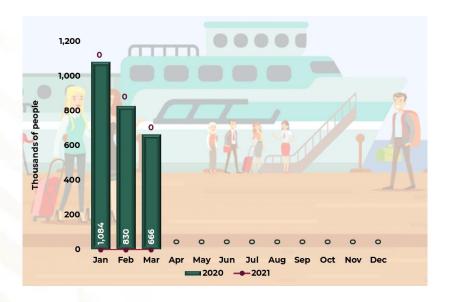

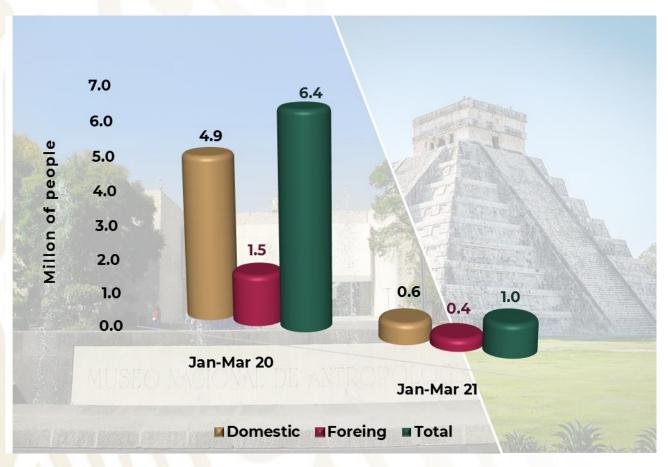

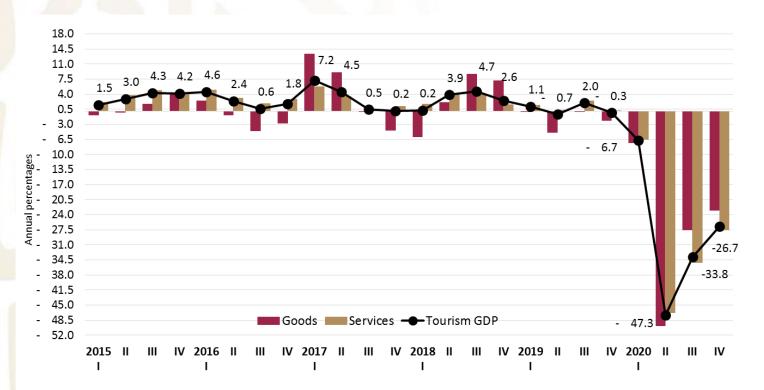




TOURIST GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

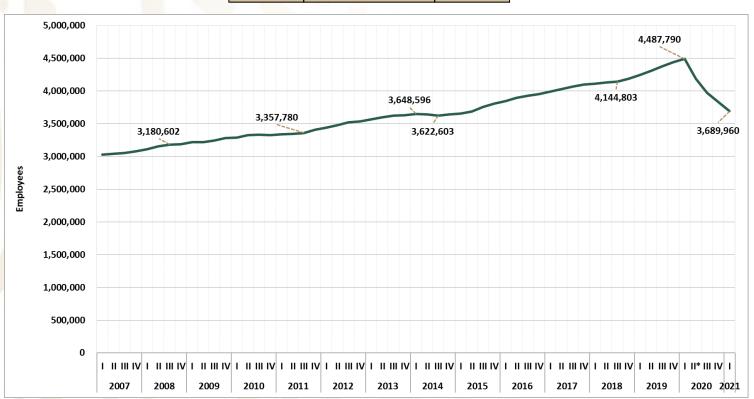




TOURIST EMPLOYMENT First Quarter of 2021

• In the first quarter of 2021, the population employed in the tourism sector in Mexico stood at 3 million 690 thousand direct jobs and represented 8.0% of total employment. Tourism employment decreased (-) 17.8% in the fourth quarter of 2020 with respect to the fourth quarter of 2020.

ECONOMIC CONTEXT (SHCP)

National

In the first quarter of 2021, the Mexican economy continued on the path of recovery that began in June 2020, which has been favored by the dynamism of the domestic market in terms of employment, consumption and investment, as well as the sustained reactivation of economic activities in the face of the reduction of COVID-19 infections, and the additional impetus that has been given by the progress in vaccination programmes in Mexico and the rest of the world, together with the economic revival of its main trading partners.

Despite the partial suspension of activities implemented at the beginning of the year to contain the pandemic and the interruption of the activities that some companies had to carry out in February, Due to shortages in the supply of natural gas from Texas and the shortage of semiconductors and plastic resins, the Mexican economy continued to recover, although with some degree of heterogeneity between sectors.

The most recent information on IGAE shows that, although the economy showed a decrease of 0.4% in the first two months of 2021 with seasonally adjusted figures, the performance of the economic activity was heterogeneous to the inside with a recovery in February of 96.0% regarding the levels pre-pandemia of February 2020.

In the secondary and tertiary sectors, the recovery reached 96.9 and 95.0% of the prepaid level, respectively, where the recovery of these sectors stands out, which in May 2020 reached 71.3 and 82.7% of their pre-pandemia level.

The sectoral dynamics of IGAE in the first quarter of 2021 is explained by the relative flexibility to adjust working conditions to continue operating outdoors and in strict compliance with sanitary measures. On the other hand, the physical, tourism and transport activities were interrupted in the two-month period and the recovery was conditioned by the regional evolution of the pandemic, health measures and the mobility of the population, as well as for the advances in the vaccination program in Mexico and the rest of the world

International

During the first quarter of 2021, the global economy continued to recover. Despite the resurgence of new waves of contagion in some regions of the world, global growth prospects for 2021 are optimistic. This is due to the international advance in vaccination campaigns, as well as the significant fiscal stimulus in the United States (USA) and the adaptation of the population and economic activities to the pandemic. In this context, the International Monetary Fund (IMF), in its April estimates, increased its projected recovery in global Gross Domestic Product (GDP) from 5.5% to 6.0% by 2021, while adjusting

The uneven recovery between sectors is due to the different adaptive capacity of economic activities to cohabit with the virus. On the one hand, manufacturing output showed a recovery in the form of a "V" and international trade showed signs of recovery from the second half of 2020. Both sectors are driven, to a greater extent, by the reestablishment of global value chains.

Specifically, in February 2021, the international trade volume index calculated by the Netherlands Bureau for Policy Analysis (CPB Netherlands) was 6.6 percentage points (pp) higher than the pre-2015 level of January 2020. Also, in March 2021, the global manufacturing PMI index registered 4.7 pp more than the level observed in January 2020.
