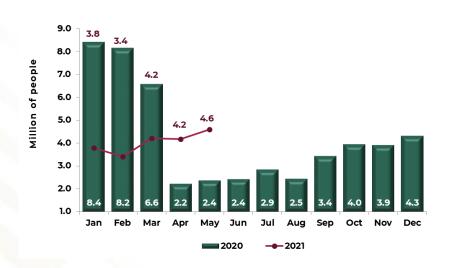

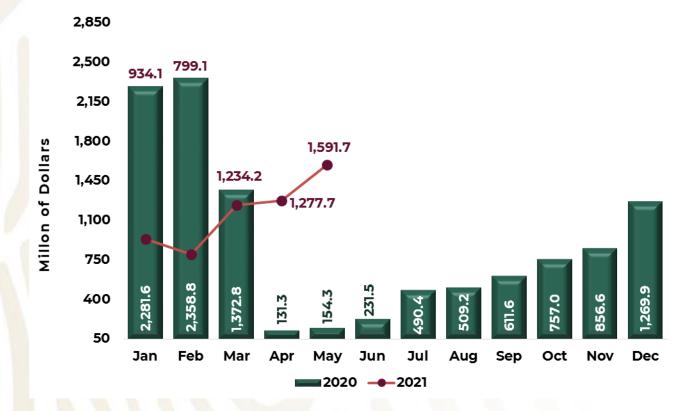

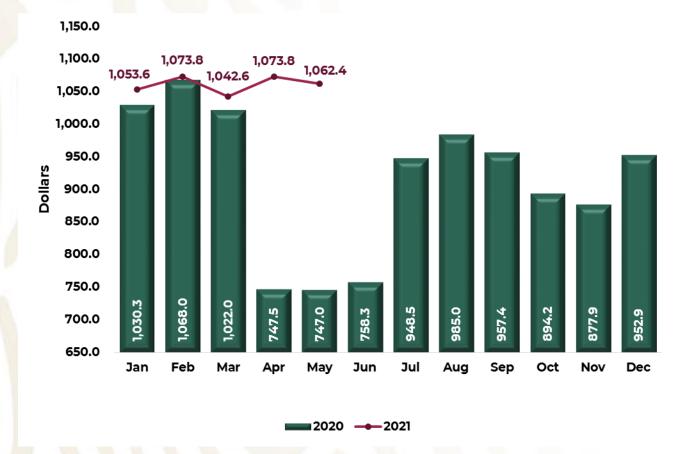

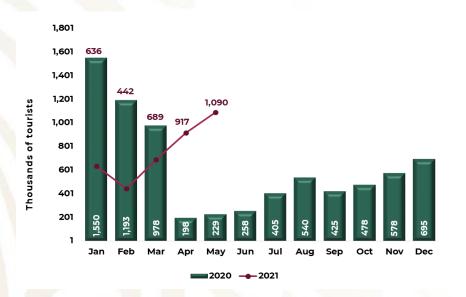

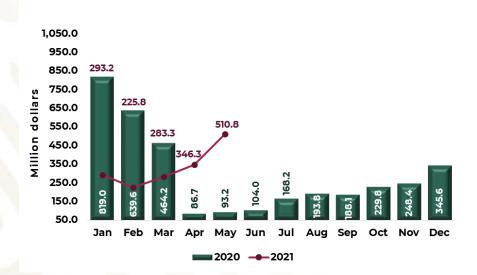

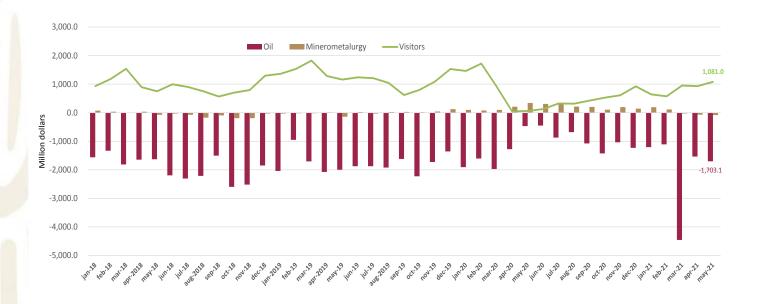

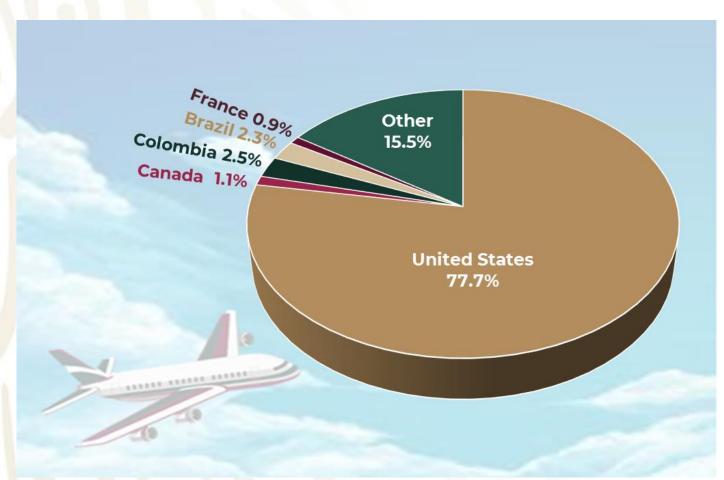






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY NATIONALITY)

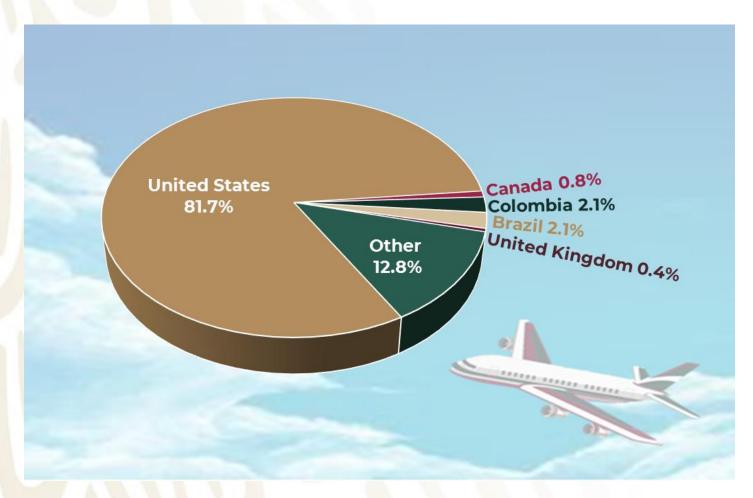






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY RESIDENCE)

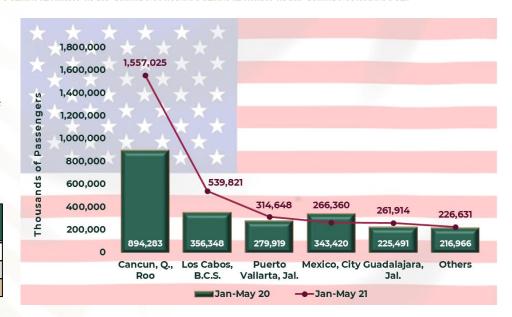




U.S CITIZENS BY AIRPORT

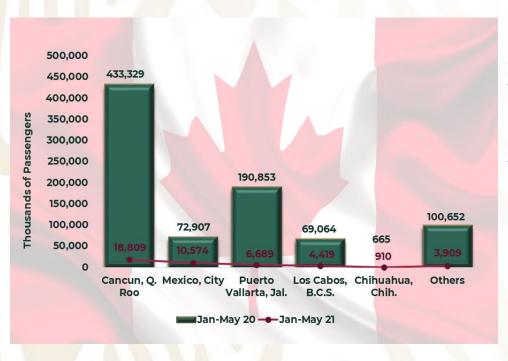

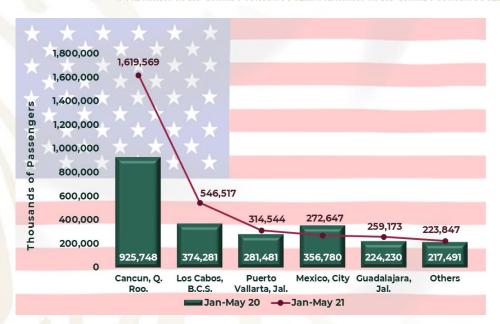


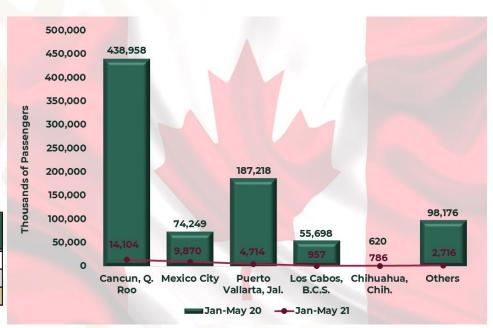

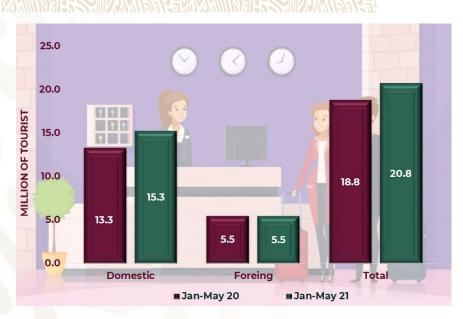

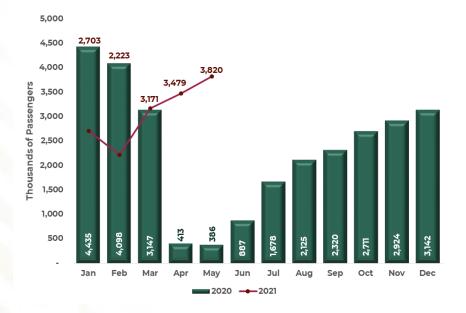

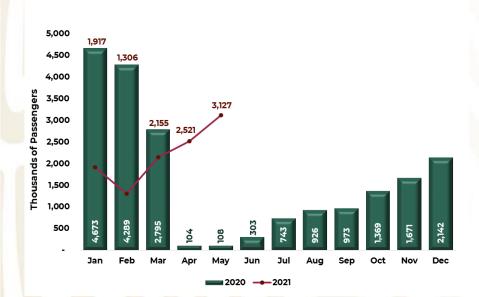

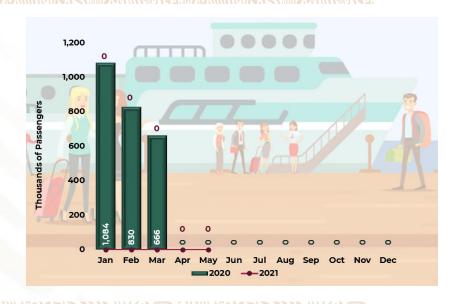

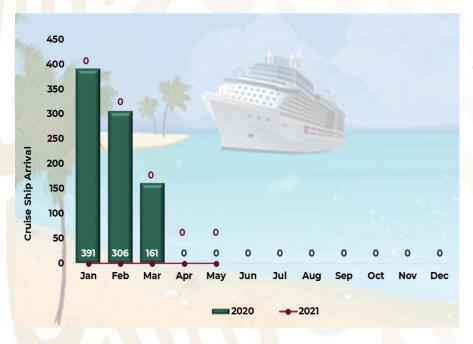

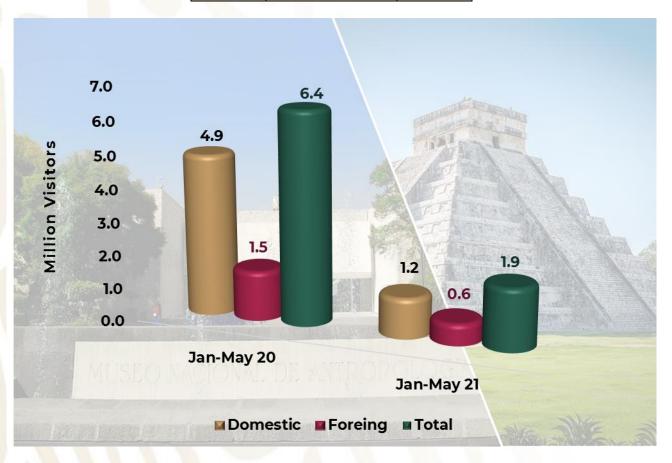

ECONOMIC CONTEXT (CENTRAL BANKO)

National

The recovery of the Mexican economy registered a significant rebound in March and some moderation in April, where progress in the vaccination process has supported the reactivation of the economy. While economic activity continues to improve, the recovery is still fragile and incomplete and the economy is far from its potential. On the demand side, the external sector continues to support the recovery, especially US demand; manufacturing exports, particularly automotive exports, continued to perform well.

While investment and consumption have improved, they still remain below their pre-pandemic levels. There is concern about the weakness and particularly low levels of investment, and this will affect economic recovery. In March, private consumption showed an annual variation of -0.7%, to be 6% below the highest level reached in 2019, although it is evident the weakness shown by the consumption of national services and semi-durable goods.

Different indicators, such as consumer confidence, the real wage bill and remittances, have improved and supported consumption, suggesting that the recovery in consumption will continue in the coming months.

International

Global economic activity continues to strengthen and this is mainly due to the availability of vaccines and stimuli to spending. Economic recovery has been mixed between countries, where China and the United States continue to lead the revival of the global economy.

For its part, the improvement in Europe is due to the reopening process in several countries, while in Japan conditions of weakness prevail in the face of new containment measures. It is noted that emerging economies are more heterogeneous due to the upturn in contagion in some regions and less space to provide additional stimuli.

However, broad slack conditions prevail in most economies. In this sense, the recovery remains incomplete, so that the total recovery is still far from being achieved and in various productive sectors, especially employment, levels are still below those recorded before the pandemic.

As for the upward adjustment in global growth forecasts, it is expected to continue to be supported mainly by the recovery in the United States and China. By 2021, the largest growth in the world economy in the last 48 years is expected, where the current recovery is set to be the fastest since the Second World War.

As for the risks, there are those associated with the pandemic, mainly, in addition to the risk of further disruptions in the production chains, which is likely to occur until a complete normalization of activities around the world is observed.
