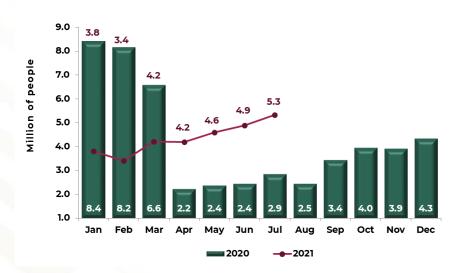

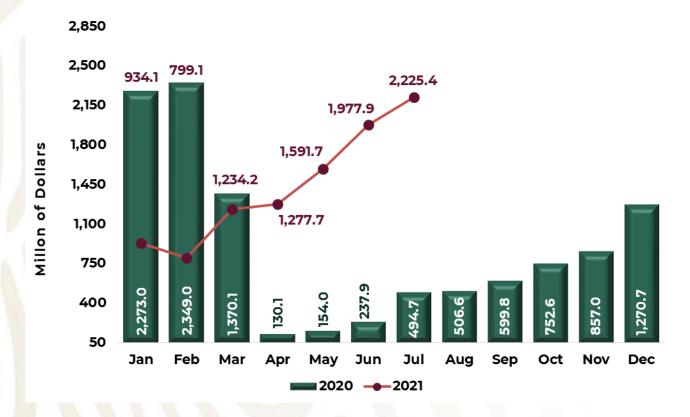

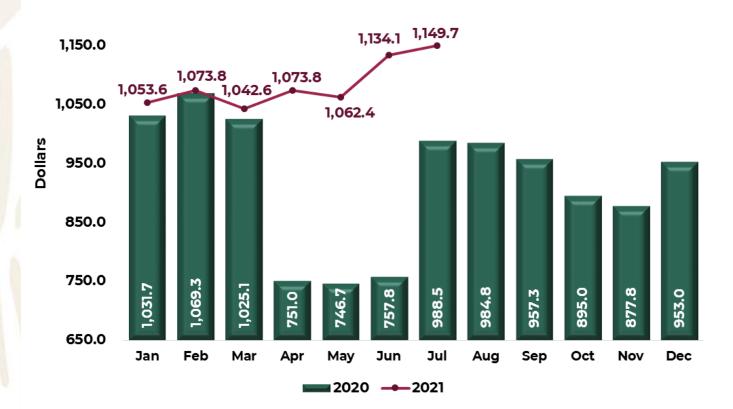

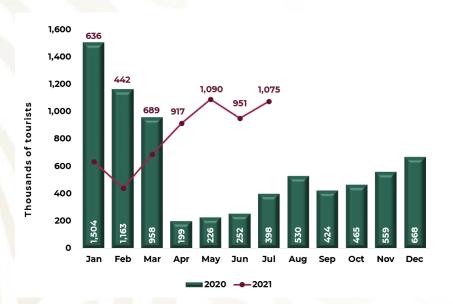

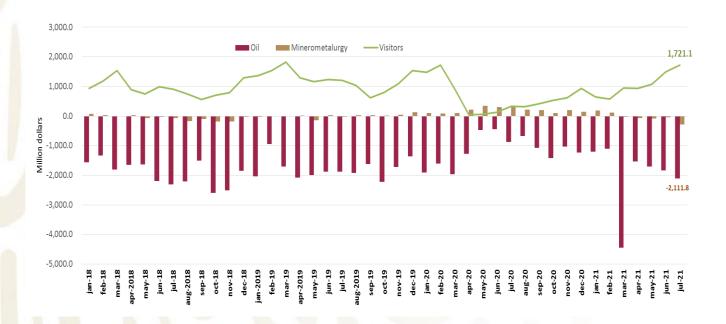

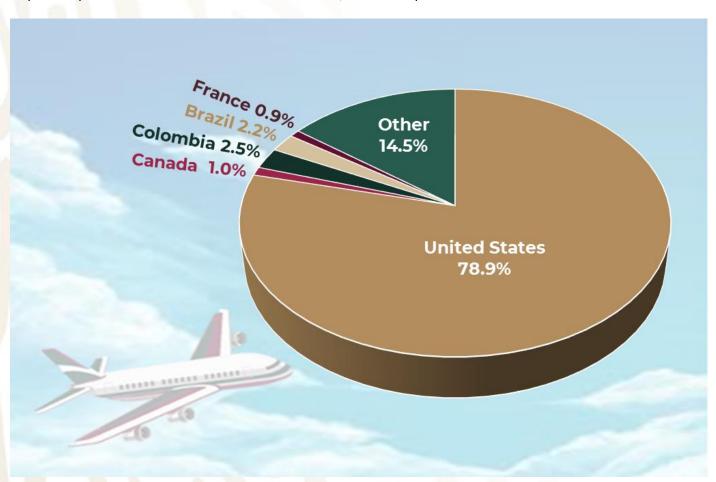






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY NATIONALITY)

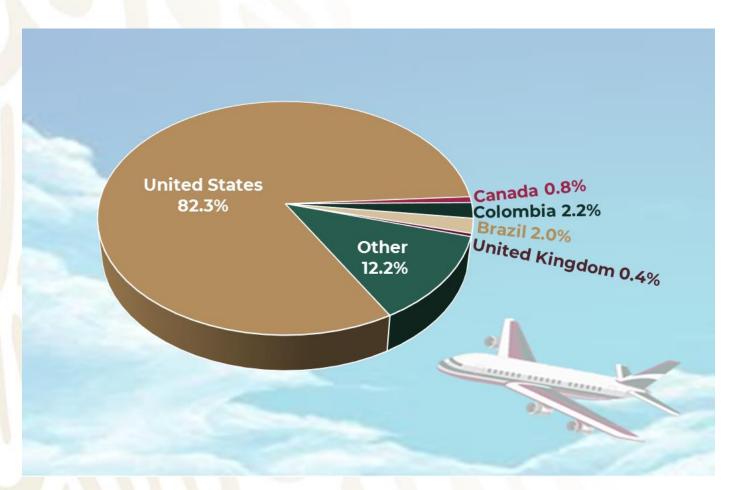






INTERNATIONAL VISITORS TO MEXICO ARRIVING BY AIR (MAIN COUNTRIES BY RESIDENCE)

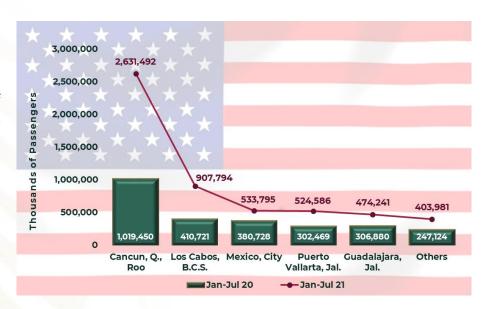




U.S CITIZENS BY AIRPORT

CANADIAN CITIZENS BY AIRPORT

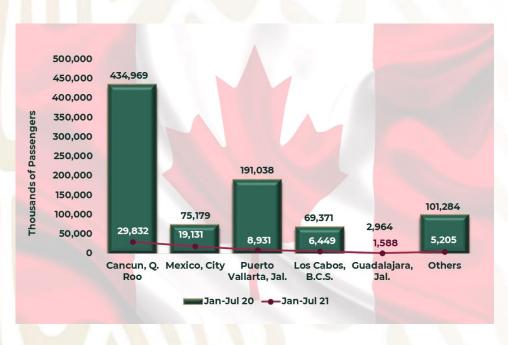

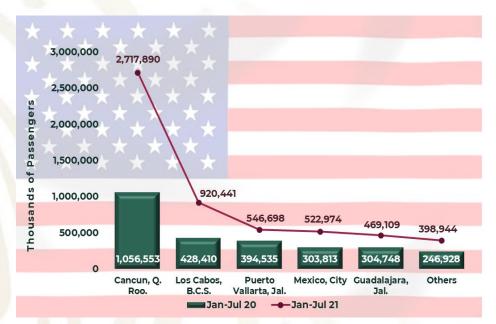

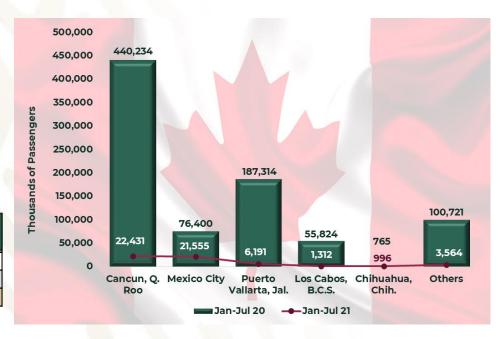

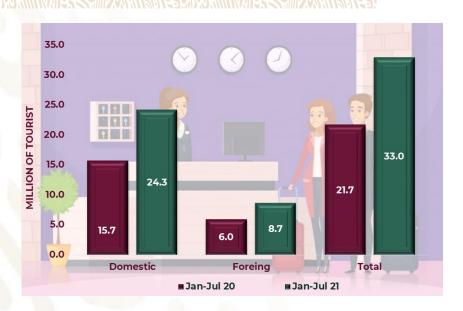

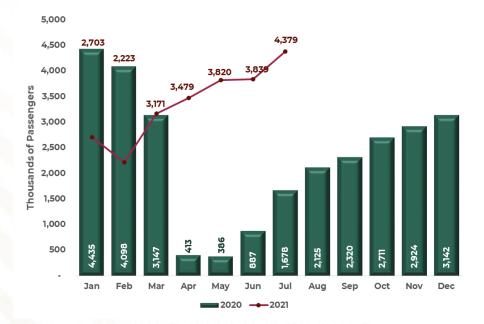

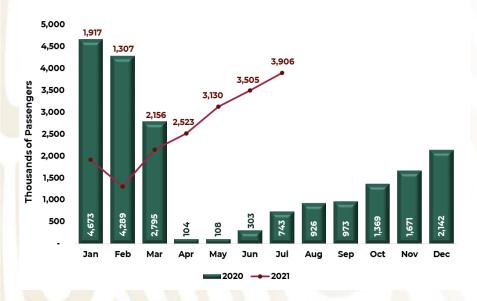

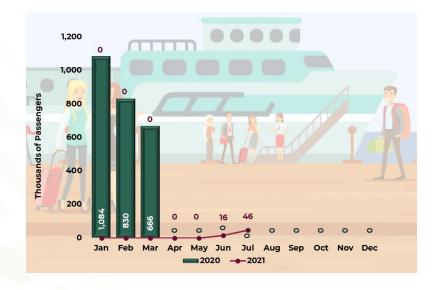

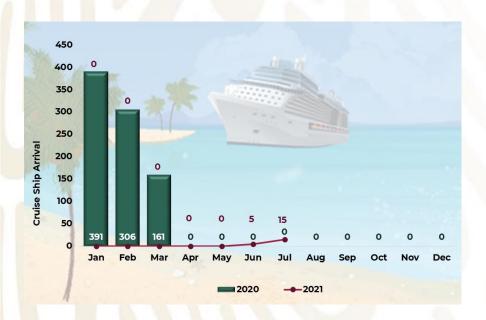

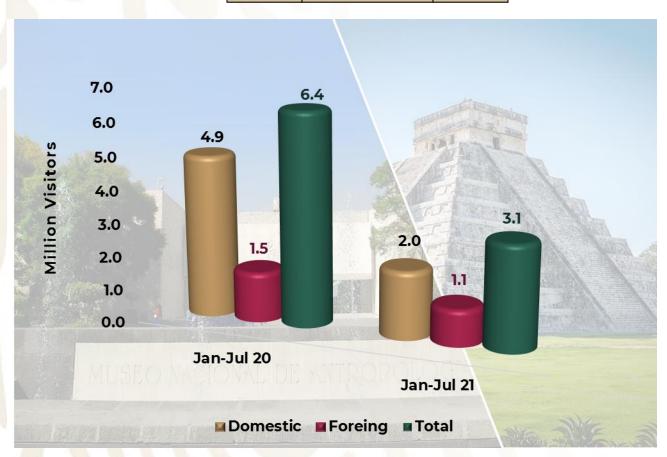

FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT IN TOURISM

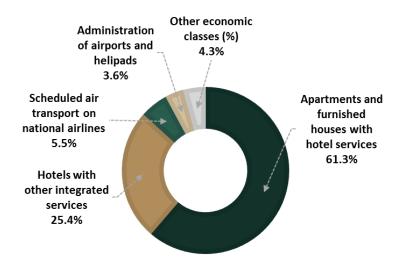
From the first quarter of 1999 to the second quarter of 2021, there was a **flow of Foreign Direct Investment in Tourism of 24,457.3 million US dollars**, with a
percentage share of 3.9% of total Foreign Direct Investment during this period

From January to June 2021, an amounts to 710.9 million dollars FDIT, which is equivalent to a growth of 178.5% compared to the investment captured in the same period of 2020, equivalent to 3.9% of total FDI.

FDIT share by type of economic activity Relative amounts: 1999-2021

Between the first quarter of 1999 and the second quarter of 2021, foreign direct investment in tourism stands out in:

- Apartments and houses furnished with hotel services (14.9 billion dollars)
- Hotels with other integrated services (6.2 billion dollars)
- Together these classes represent 86.7% of the total FDIT in that period.

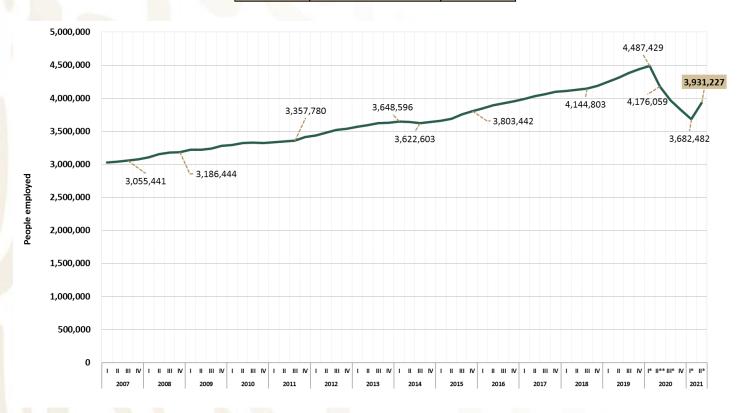




TOURIST EMPLOYMENT Second Quarter of 2021

• In the second quarter of 2021, the population employed in the tourism sector in Mexico stood at 3 million 931 thousand direct jobs and represented 8.1% of total employment. Tourism employment decreased (-) 5.9% in the second quarter of 2021 with respect to the second quarter of 2020.

ECONOMIC CONTEXT (Ministry of Finance and Public Credit)

National

In the second quarter of 2021, economic activity in Mexico accumulated four consecutive quarters of growth and reached 97.9% of the level observed in the fourth quarter of 2019, prior to the outbreak and subsequent COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, as of July, Mexico has recovered all the jobs lost due to the global pandemic, according to INEGI.

The recovery in our country has been faster than anticipated and both international organizations and analysts have constantly revised upwards their growth projections for 2021.

Among the actions that the Government of Mexico implemented to facilitate economic recovery, four stand out: first, the priority assigned to the fight against the pandemic and to the preservation of health, exemplified in the timely implementation of the National Vaccination Program, which is allowing for a more rapid reopening than that envisaged in the CGPE 2021; secondly, the social welfare supports granted since the start of administration, investment in infrastructure and decent work policies, supplemented by additional support to mitigate the effects of the pandemic, which has helped to maintain consumption and strengthen working conditions for workers; thirdly, the widely recognized fiscal responsibility that supports macroeconomic stability and investor confidence; and fourthly, the strengthening of global value chains within the framework of the Free Trade Agreement between Mexico, USA and Canada (T-MEC), which has given an additional boost to demand and investment.

Secondly, the social welfare supports initiated in 2019, the approved labor reforms and the boost to public and private investment in infrastructure, have helped to strengthen private income and support economic activity.

International

The world economy has shown a marked economic recovery since the second half of 2020, as the distancing measures have been better targeted and with partial and limited closures compared to those implemented at the beginning of the pandemic. In addition, the production and distribution of vaccines have been accelerated by facilitating their implementation and the gradual reopening of activities.

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) estimates that the global economy will grow 6.0% in 2021, a figure that was revised upwards from the rates of 5.5 and 5.2% forecast in January this year and October 2020, respectively. In addition, and despite the disruptions observed to global value chains as a result of the pandemic, the IMF projects by 2021 an increase in the volume of global trade of 9.7%, which it considers an even greater growth for emerging and developing economies, of 11.1%.

However, there is a marked divergence in reactivation between different regions of the world, associated with markedly unequal access to vaccines to combat the SARS-CoV-2 virus. As of September 3, 2021, 58.2% of the population in advanced economies had received complete vaccination schemes, while the proportion was 29.2% in emerging economies and only 5.7% in low-income countries, according to data from the University of Oxford.

This means a slower recovery outlook for the last two groups of countries, which will deepen existing economic and social gaps with respect to advanced economies, as well as a greater likelihood of new variants of the virus, with the risk of affecting the overall recovery.
