

















### **U.S CITIZENS BY AIRPORT**









### OCCUPANCY RATE















### **VISITORS TO MUSEUMS AND ARCHEOLOGICAL SITES**






### **TOURIST GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT**

### **ECONOMIC CONTEXT (Ministry of Finance and Public Credit)**

#### **National**

The progress of the National Vaccination Plan contributed to the consolidation of the domestic market, as well as to maintaining the solid performance of economic activity and the labour market during the third quarter, in a complex global environment in terms of inflation, supply of goods and acceleration of contagion by COVID-19.

While most sectors of the economy continued in their recovery phase, some items fell back on the previous quarter due to the presence of external factors that reduced their performance:

- In the first instance, despite the upturn in the number of COVID-19 infections in the third wave, the successful progress of the vaccination campaign has led to a reduction in the mortality of the disease, This situation has led to greater mobility and reduced impact on economic activity compared with 2020
- Second, supply chains were disrupted by shortages of industrial inputs and bottlenecks affecting transport
  equipment manufacturing activities. However, manufacturing, construction and non-oil mining showed greater
  resilience than expected and continued to recover to pre-pandemia levels.

In this context, according to IGAE in the two-month period July-August 2021, the economic recovery was 97.4% compared to the level of February 2020, where the agricultural and livestock sector registered an advance towards pre-pandemia levels with a level of 108.7%, followed by the industrial sector in 97.8% and services in 96.5%.

#### International

During the third quarter of 2021, the world experienced the third peak of contagion from the COVID-19 pandemic; however, pressure on health systems was lower than in the previous two waves due to progress in vaccination programs. According to Oxford University, 1.7 billion people were vaccinated during the quarter. In total, as of September 30, 3.6 billion people, representing 45.5% of the world's population, received at least one dose of the vaccine.

In this context, economic activity was strong. Although the global composite PMI\*, an indicator that records the approximate behavior of world GDP, decreased 3.6 points during the third quarter, the progress of vaccination allowed that mobility did not decrease as much as in the first two waves of contagion. Thus, in September, the global composite PMI recorded 53.0 points, thus staying in expansion terrain and above its pre-pandemia level of January 2020.

In turn, global demand was driven by consumption that slowed its growth rate. In particular, global service and manufacturing MIPs dropped 4.1 and 1.4 points during the quarter and in September were at 53.4 and 54.1 points, respectively. However, both remain above their pre-pandemic level.

In addition, the spread of the virus prolonged the disruption of global value chains, which affected both industrial production and international trade, which fell by 0.5% and 0.7% respectively between June and August 2021, according to the most recent information available. However, it should be noted that both indicators remained above their pre-pandemia level.
