


























#### OCCUPANCY RATE






















## VISITORS TO MUSEUMS AND ARCHEOLOGICAL SITES

# OTHERS INDICATORS AND ANALYSIS OF INTERNATIONAL TOURISM

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#### **ECONOMIC CONTEXT (Ministry of Finance)**

#### **National**

In line with what was observed in the rest of the world, in 2021 the Mexican economy continued its recovery towards pre-pandemia levels. This shows that, in the fourth quarter of the year, economic activity recovered 96.7% of its level in the fourth quarter of 2019, with data adjusted for seasonality. This restoration was supported both by the advancement of mobility in the main cities of the country and the gradual and orderly reopening of economic activities, and by the recovery of the sectors most affected by the pandemic, as well as the improvement observed in the manufacturing, construction and trade sectors.

The greatest openness and dynamism of economic activities were recorded particularly in those with high contact between people, such as temporary accommodation and beverage preparation services, and transport, which recorded high annual growth rates amounting to 33.1% and 15.0%, respectively. Therefore, its contribution to the annual GDP was considerable and overall represented 1.4 pp, highlighting in its interior the activities of terrestrial transport of passengers and the autotransporte of cargo, as well as the temporary accommodation. However, these activities did not complete their recovery with respect to pre-pandemia levels since, for the first case, it stood at 83.6%, while for the second, it reached 98.1% with data adjusted for seasonality.

Along these lines, regions linked to tourism and services of high social interaction, advanced in their recovery, although they continue to show lags compared to 2019. Such is the case of Quintana Roo and Baja California Sur that in the third quarter of 2021 expanded 25.6 and 15.0% annually, respectively, and have a recovery of 94.0 and 87.5% compared to the fourth quarter of 2019.

It should be noted that the Mexican economy was affected by the appearance of new waves of contagion of COVID-19 throughout the year, especially in the tourism sector and other related **International** 

Regarding the external environment, world economic activity continued recovering during the fourth quarter of 2021, although at a lower-than-expected rate, given the persistent bottlenecks in supply chains and a lesser mobility associated to the resurgence of infections caused by the omicron variant of the SARSCoV-2 virus by the end of that year. These factors are anticipated to continue affecting economic activity in the first quarter of 2022, although they are expected to be shorter-lived and less intense than in the previous waves of the pandemic.

Thus, the growth outlook for the world economy for 2022, as a whole, was revised slightly downwards, reflecting the lower probability of a greater fiscal stimulus being approved in the United States, of a faster withdrawal of monetary stimulus in systemically important economies, of a lesser mobility due to the resurgence of the pandemic, and more lasting-than-anticipated disruptions to supply chains.

These previsions remain subject to a high degree of uncertainty, especially associated with the evolution of the pandemic, or the possibility of the latter becoming endemic, the vaccination process worldwide, distortions in supply chains, persistent inflationary pressures, and adjustments in monetary and financial conditions. In addition, the intensification of the conflict between Russia and Ukraine could also have repercussions on growth, inflation and the stability of the global financial system.
