



















































ECONOMIC CONTEXT (Ministry of Finance)

National

It is expected that in the second quarter of 2022 the Mexican economy will maintain the economic recovery, supported by the better performance of tertiary activities.

On the supply side, industrial production continued to recover in April, given the good performance of the manufacturing sector. On the demand side, the recovery of consumption stands out, where various determinants of consumption remain at high levels, such as consumer confidence, the wage bill and remittances.

In fact, the monthly indicator of private consumption has been ten consecutive months with increases in the margin, driven mainly by the consumption of services and nondurable goods.- Consumption of goods and services has already surpassed pre-pandemic levels, where some advanced indicators, such as ANTAD sales and credit and debit card spending, suggest that private consumption continued to improve in the second quarter of 2022.

The investment showed an improvement in March, driven by the non-transport machinery and equipment component. However, investment continues to be sluggish, particularly in construction components and transport equipment.

The various labour market indicators have continued to improve, although the recovery remains incomplete. Unemployment, underemployment and labour participation rates, as well as IMSS-affiliated employment, have continued to show progress.

International

Available international indicators suggest that global economic activity slowed during the second quarter, mainly affected by mobility restrictions in China and the impact of the Russia-Ukraine war.

While performance remains heterogeneous across countries and sectors, declining fiscal and monetary stimuli in the United States have begun to affect some components of GDP, such as residential investment, although consumption continues to show dynamism.

The US recovery continues, albeit with a reduction in consumer confidence and a weakening of growth expectations. Labour markets in advanced economies continue to operate strong, with increases in wages and vacancies.

Global inflation continued to rise, reaching peak levels in some countries in four decades, as a result of persistent supply-demand imbalances and food and energy price pressures. Thus, inflation in most advanced and emerging economies remained above the targets of their respective central banks.
