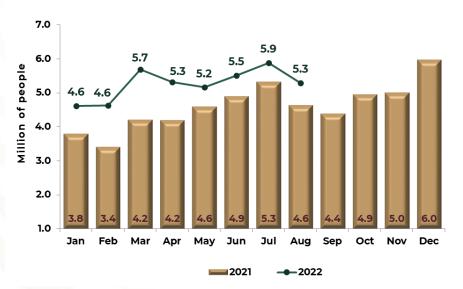

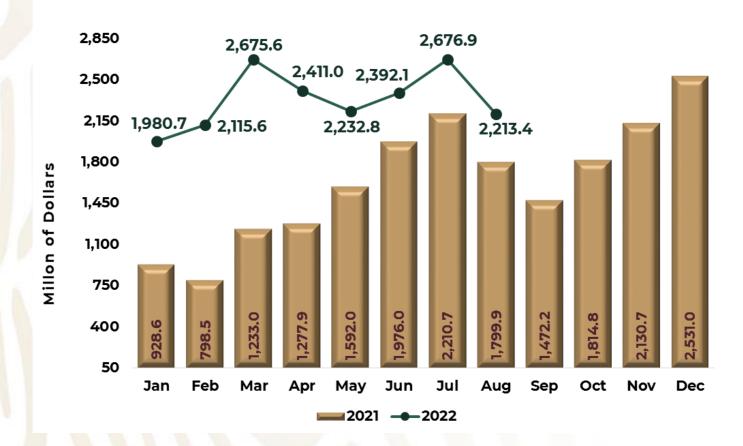

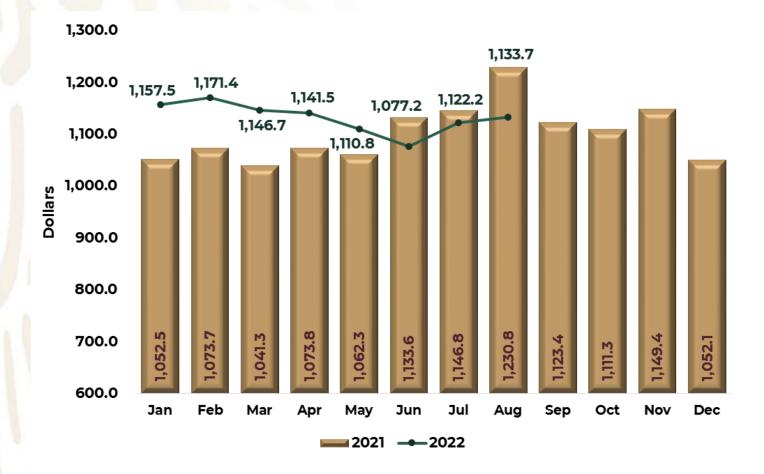




AVERAGE EXPENDITURE OF LONG-STAY TOURISTS, AIR TRANSPORT

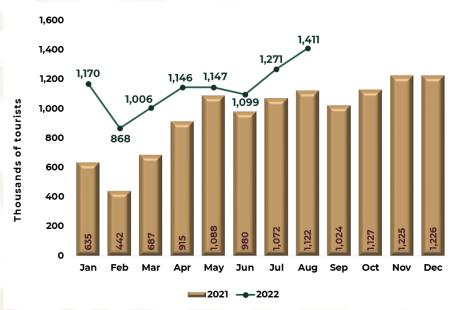

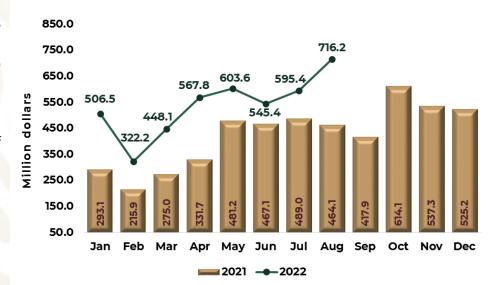

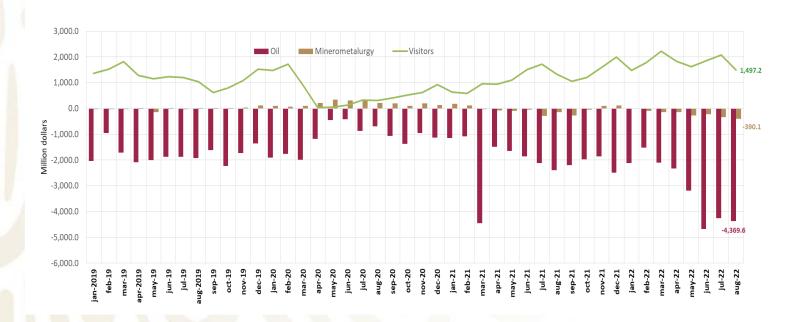

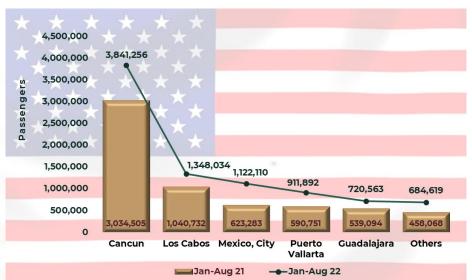

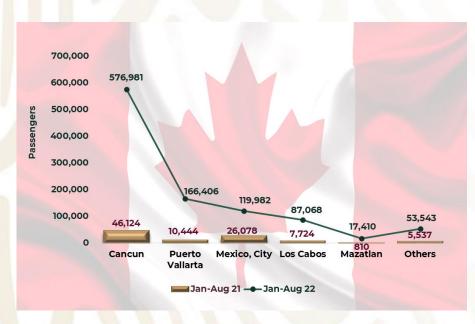

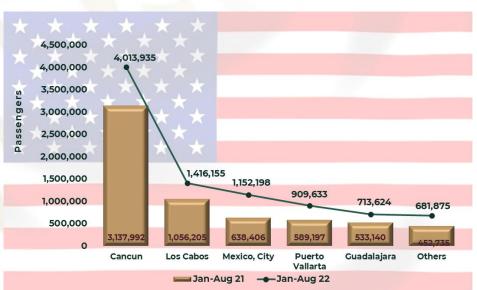


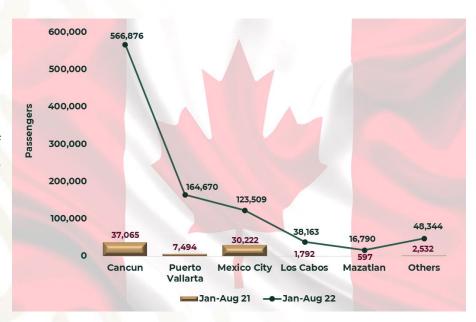

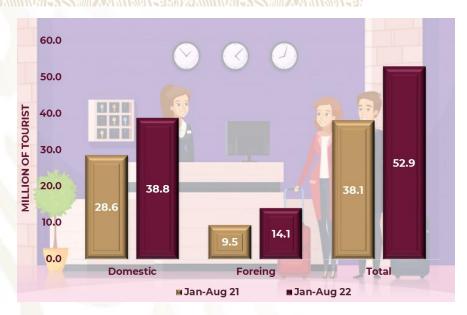

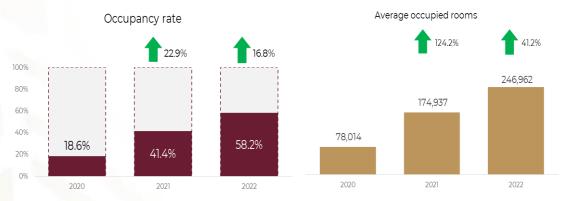

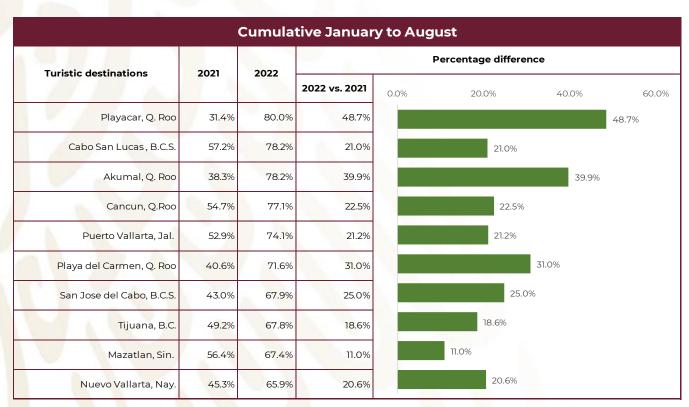

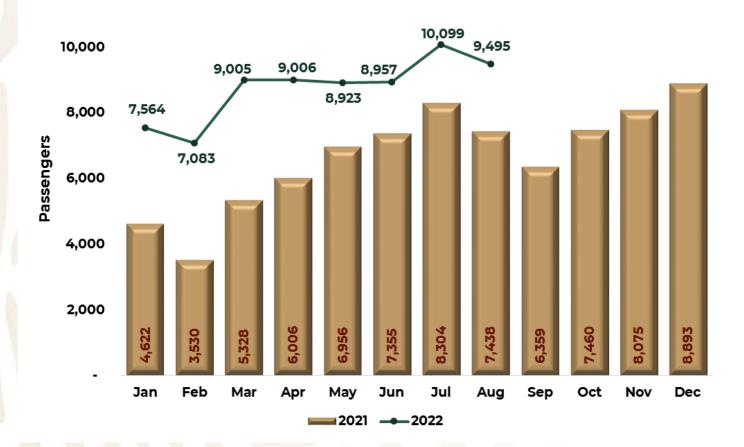

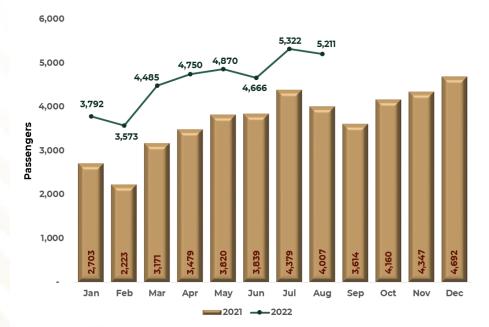

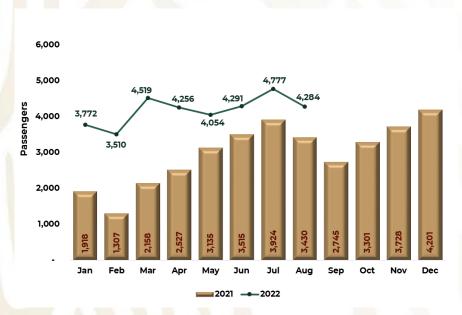

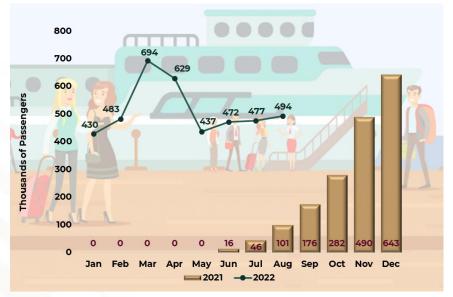

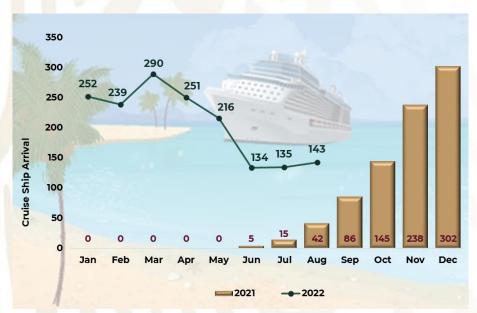

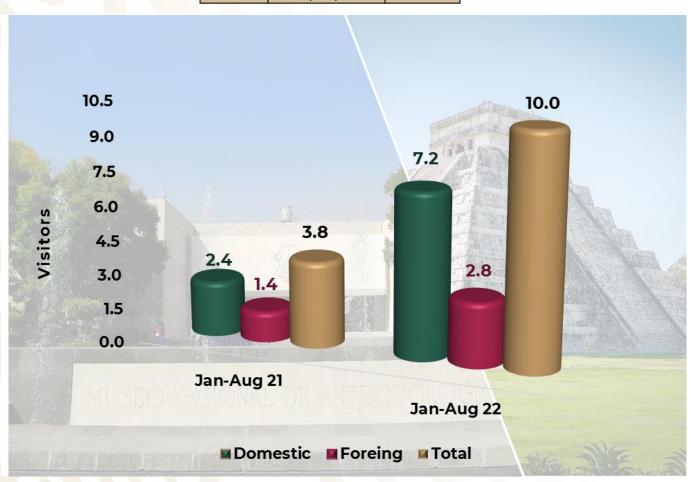

OTHERS INDICATORS AND ANALYSIS OF INTERNATIONAL TOURISM

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ECONOMIC CONTEXT (Ministry of Finance)

National

At the domestic level, national economic activity has continued its gradual recovery process following the shock caused by the COVID19 pandemic, albeit at an apparently slower pace at the margin. Moving forward, there remains the risk of further weakening of domestic demand, both by consumption and by investment, combined with a potential loss of export dynamism. The sovereign credit rating continues to maintain the investment grade with a stable outlook by seven rating agencies for the coming months, after one of them announced a reduction in July this year and adjusted its outlook to stable. Pemex's credit rating also declined in July, and no further adjustments are expected in the coming months.

In Mexico, in line with what was observed globally, domestic financial markets showed mixed behavior and episodes of volatility, reflecting the environment of greater uncertainty and risk aversion.

The exchange market was generally stable, while interest rates increased across the curve, albeit to a greater extent over shorter periods. In this environment, global risks to financial stability persist.

Largely as a result of sharp adjustments in monetary policy positions in various economies, global financial conditions may be constrained more rapidly or disorderly than anticipated. It is also possible that volatility conditions in global financial markets will continue, with possible implications for domestic markets, while there is also the risk that the recovery process in the world economy will be delayed by lower than anticipated growth

International

The Mexican financial system faces different challenges in the face of the current situation, characterized by persistent global inflationary pressures, a greater restriction of financial conditions, Lower growth prospects and high volatility in international financial markets.

The outlook for global economic activity has deteriorated and global inflation continued to rise, driven mainly by high food and energy prices. In this context, monetary policy in various jurisdictions has accelerated its adjustment process, in response to persistently high inflation readings and rising expectations for this variable.

In fact, the Federal Reserve has twice raised the target range for the federal funds rate, reporting that additional increases are likely to be appropriate, while continuing the process of reducing its balance sheet. Several advanced and emerging economies also continued to adjust their reference rates upwards.

Thus, global financial conditions have continued to tighten, with additional increases in interest rates and a trend of strengthening the dollar in an environment of increased risk aversion and volatile rebounds in international financial markets.
