

















































ECONOMIC CONTEXT (Ministry of Finance)

National

In 2022, economic activity registered an annual growth of 3.1%, higher than its historical average from 2011 to 2019. It should be noted that, since the fourth quarter of 2021, activity has registered consecutive quarterly growth, derived from the good pace of the services and industrial sectors, which presented continuous quarterly increases by five and seven quarters, respectively. With these results, the level of GDP in the fourth quarter of 2022 reached a new historic peak.

In the domestic market he highlighted the growth of private consumption of goods and, in particular, of services that closed their gap with their prepandemia levels. The main elements that contributed to this result were the strength of the labor market, the increases in consumer confidence, the increase in consumer credit, the income from remittances and the effects of social programs promoted by this administration. In addition, gross fixed investment continued its upward trend. In particular, the investment in construction closed the year with a better performance than observed at the beginning of 2022 due to the slowdown in the prices of construction materials, as well as future demand prospects for the relocation of companies and large public works projects with a regional focus.

On the other hand, the external sector was favored by the inflow of foreign exchange from Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), as well as by the levels of manufacturing and oil exports, which registered record levels. On the other hand, remittance flows and tourism revenues also registered historic highs with the high levels of wage bill of Mexican migrants in the U.S. and the record arrival of international visitors. All these factors continued to drive the national economy and high levels of international reserves.

International

In 2022, the accumulation of external clashes before the geopolitical conflict with Ukraine, the partial closures in China by the COVID-19 and the tightening of global monetary policy to contain inflationary pressures slowed down the economy's growth rate. However, the second half of the year saw signs of strength in the world's major economies, improving growth prospects for 2022 and 2023. Domestic demand proved to be more resilient than anticipated in the US. and in the euro area, while the normalization of supply chains reduced input costs and increased industrial production. Global energy prices fell from their peak reached in the middle of 2022.

On the other hand, in 2022, inflationary pressures prevailed due to the lags in the labour market, wage pressures and the aftermath of the pandemic, as well as a risk of disintegration of inflation expectations in the short term. This led central banks to tighten their monetary policy, with rate increases in magnitudes that had not been seen in nearly three decades, to reduce excess aggregate demand and contain inflationary pressures through the expectations channel.
