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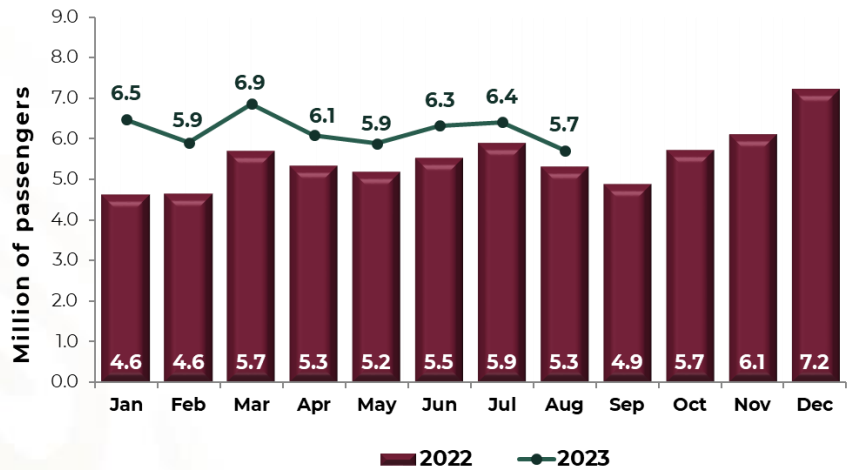




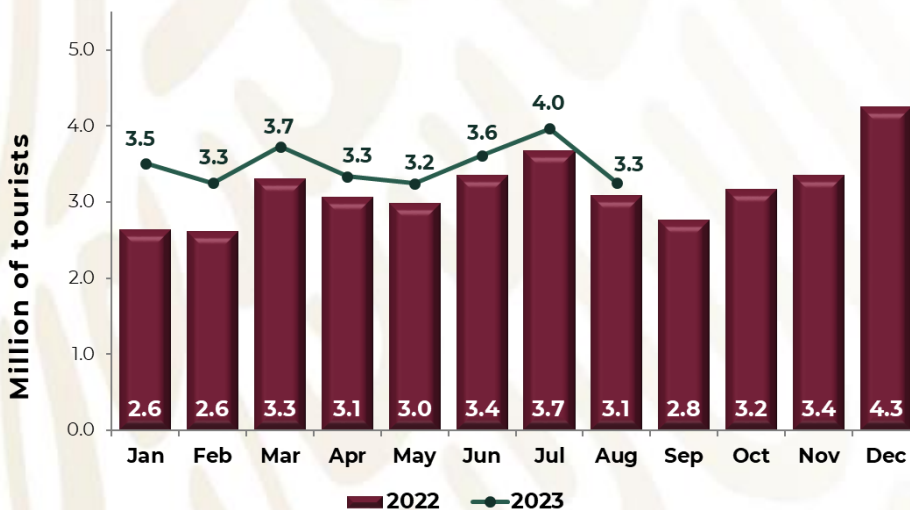
## Arrival Of International Visitors to Mexico

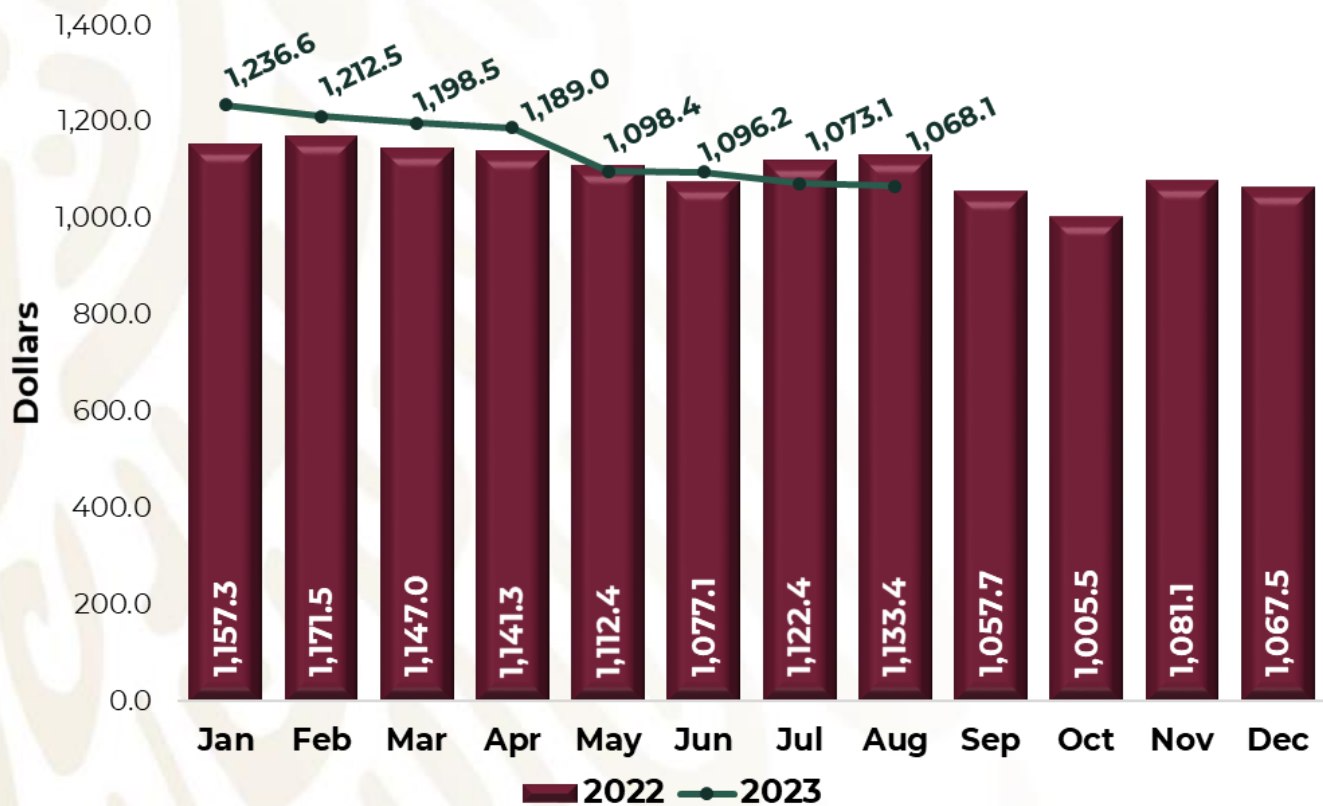

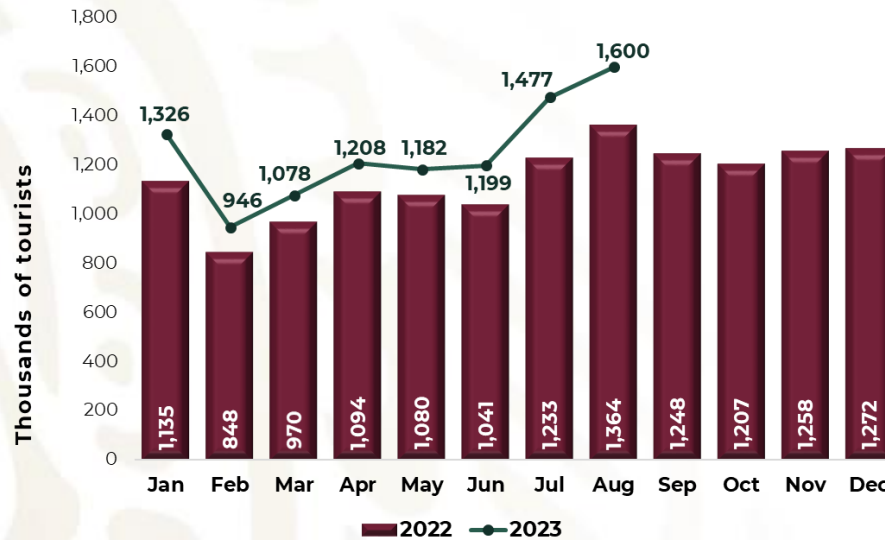

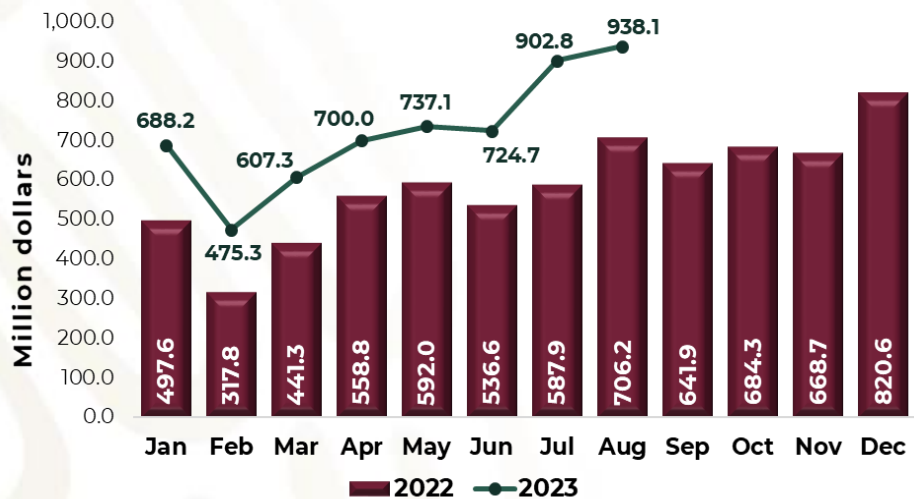

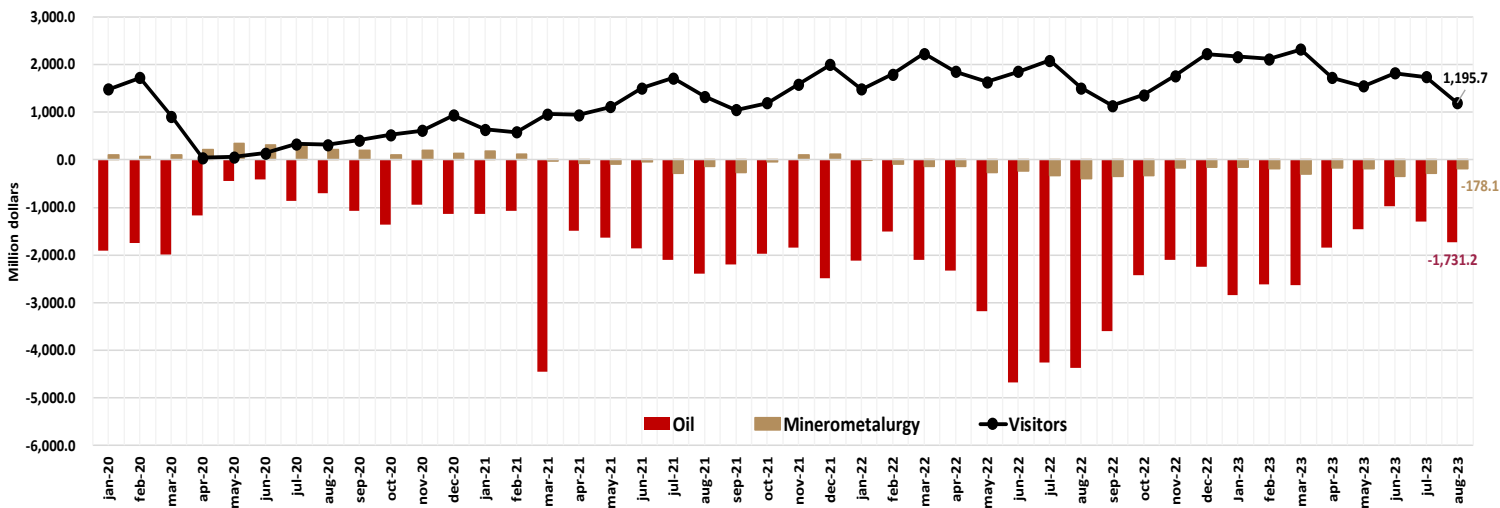

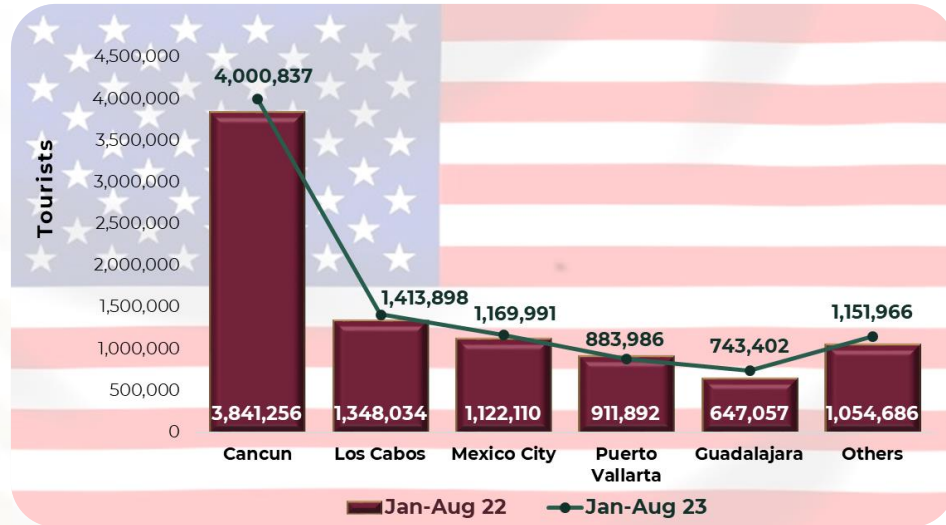

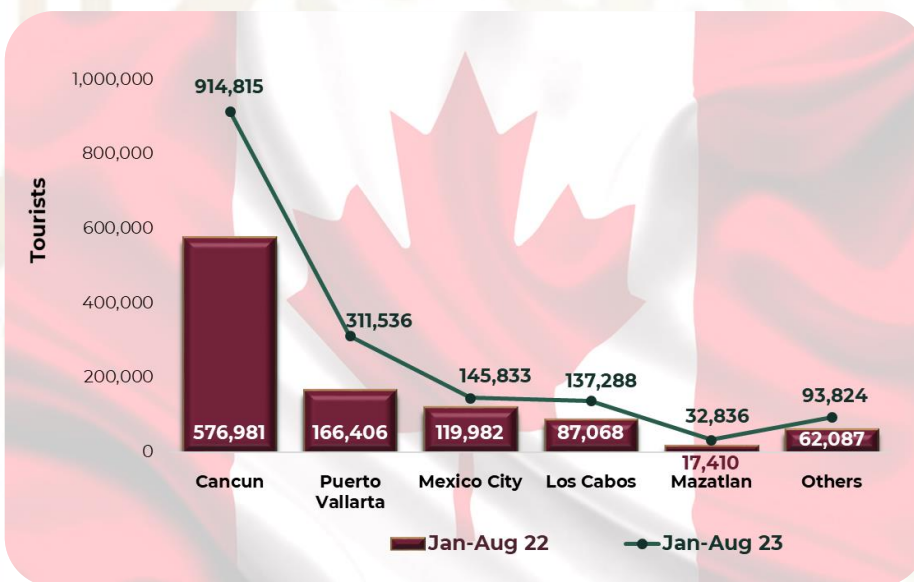

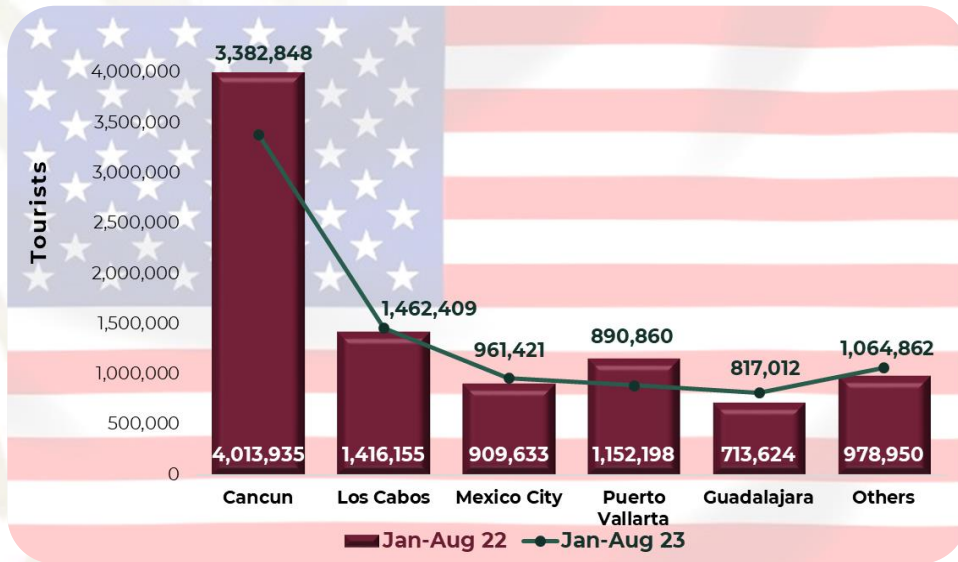

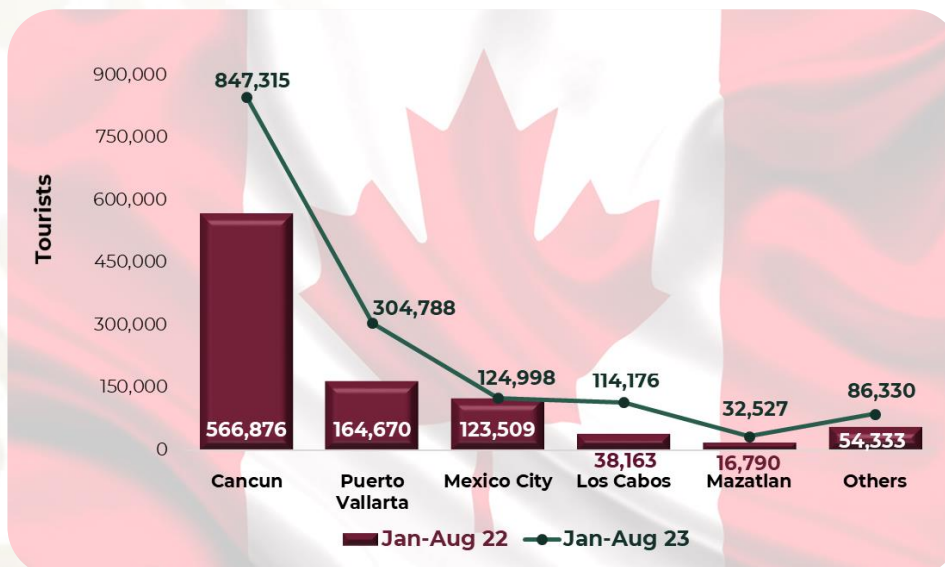

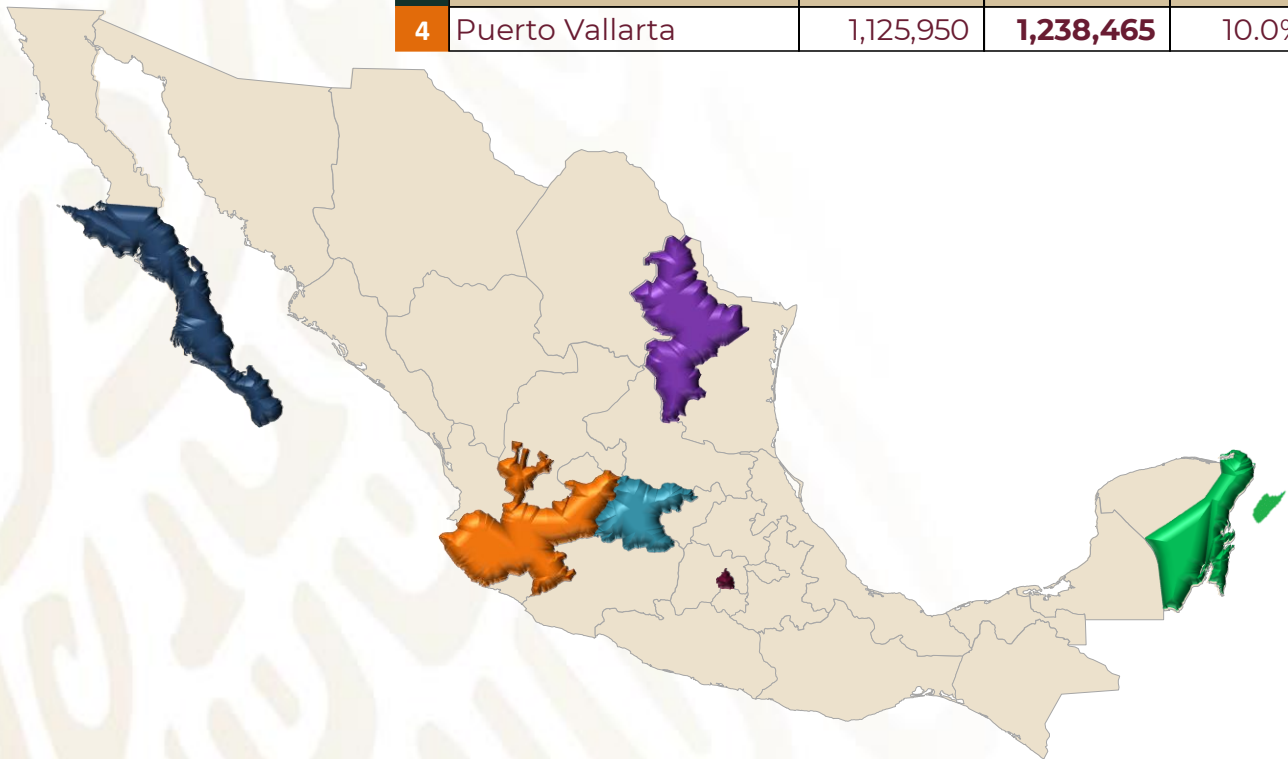

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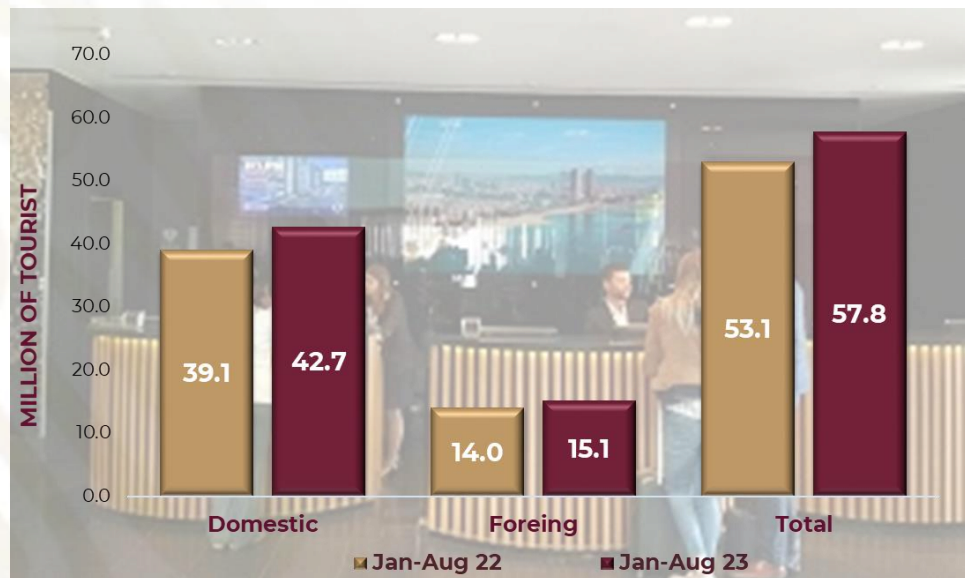
## Occupancy Rate

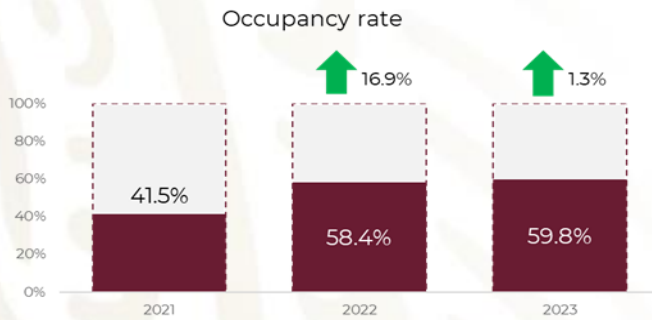

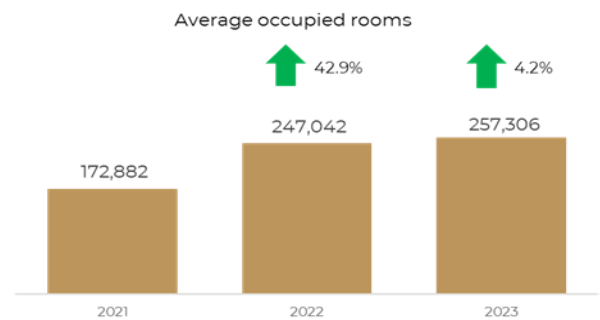

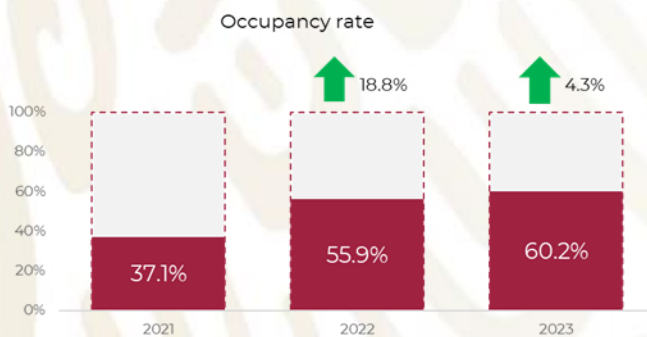

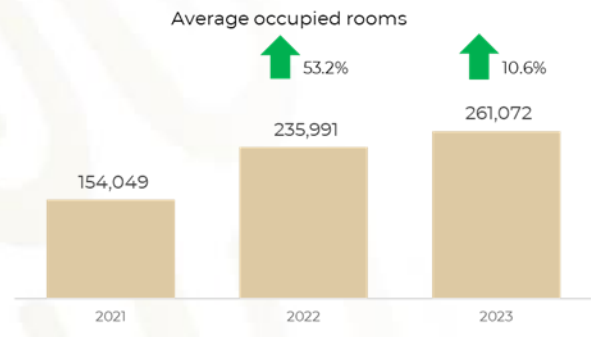

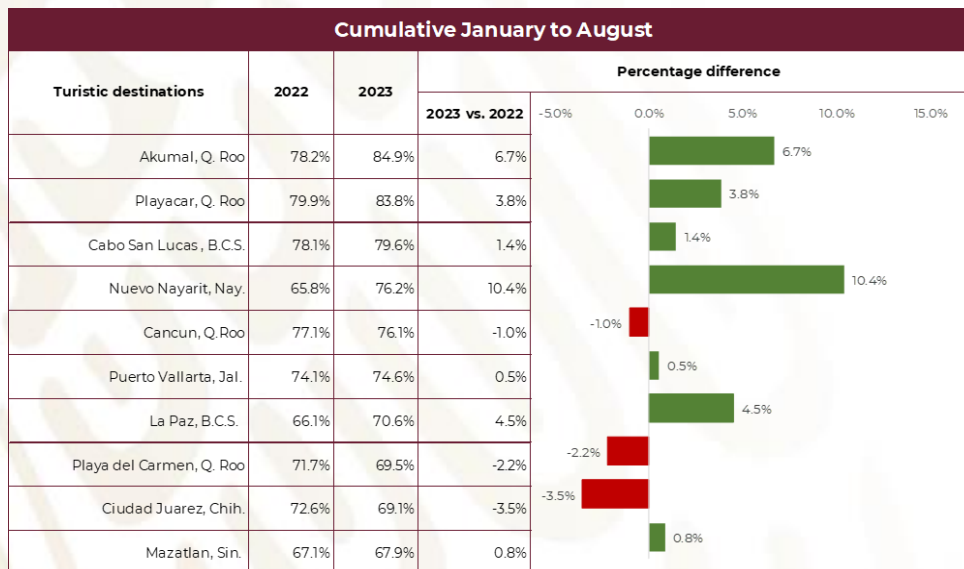
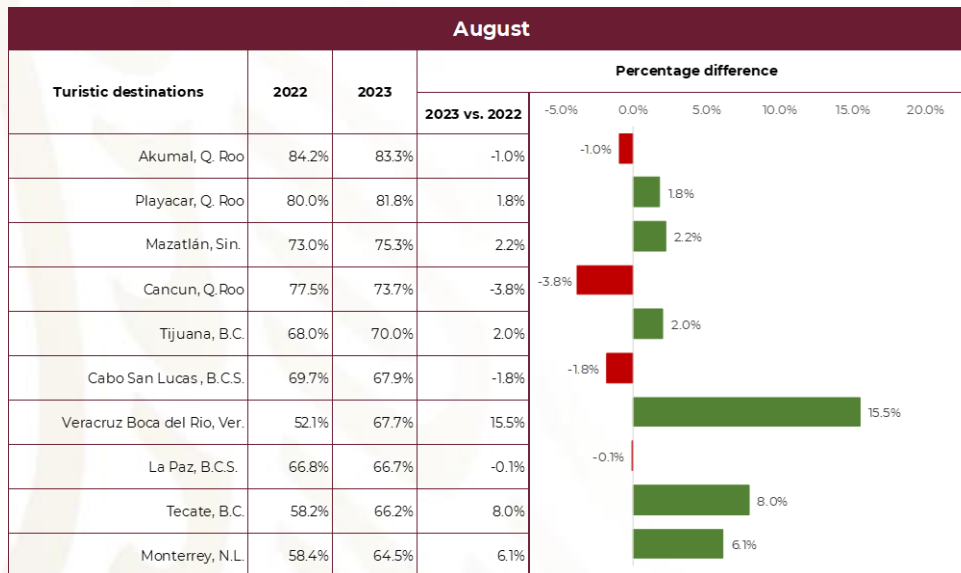

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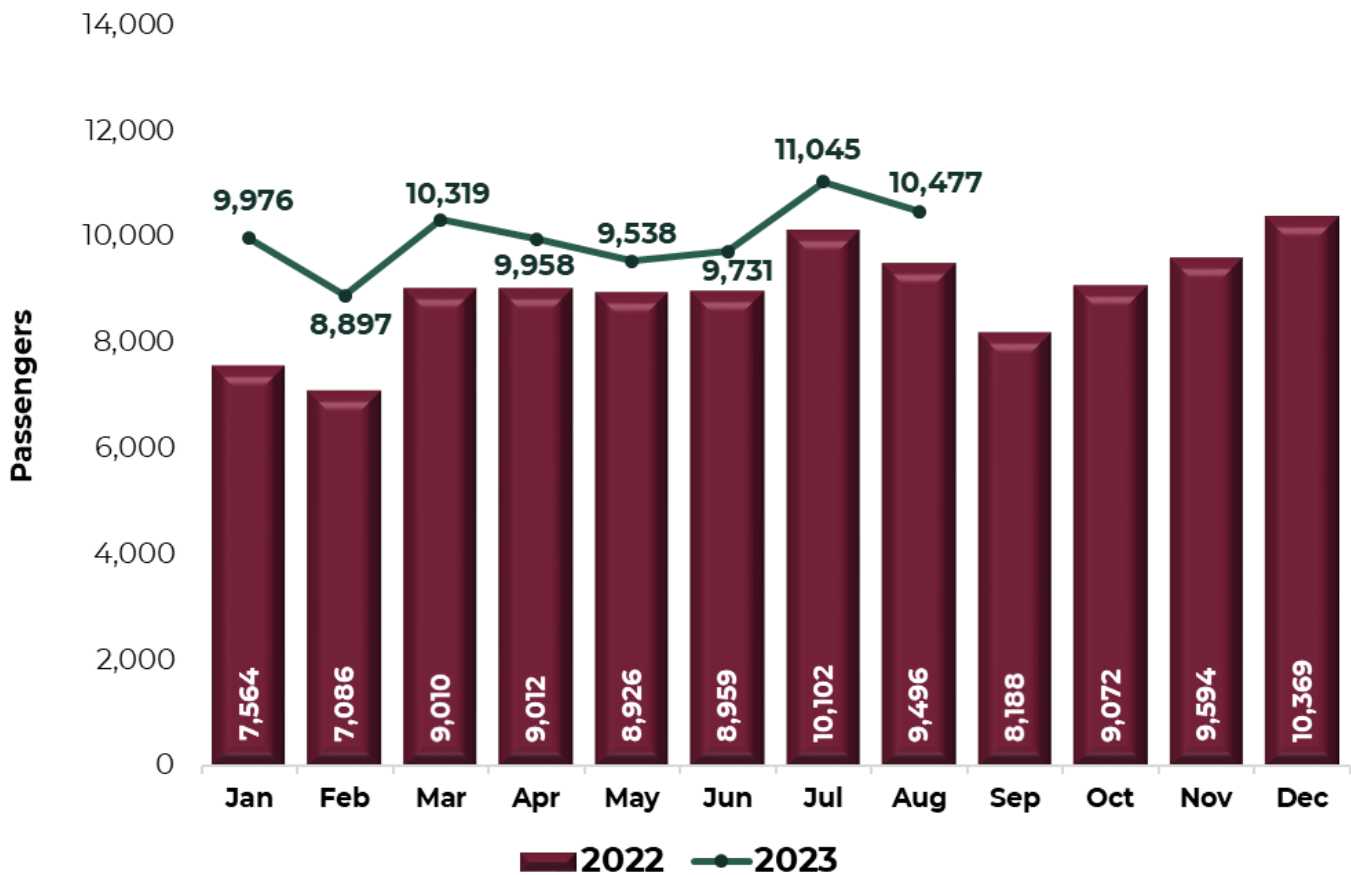

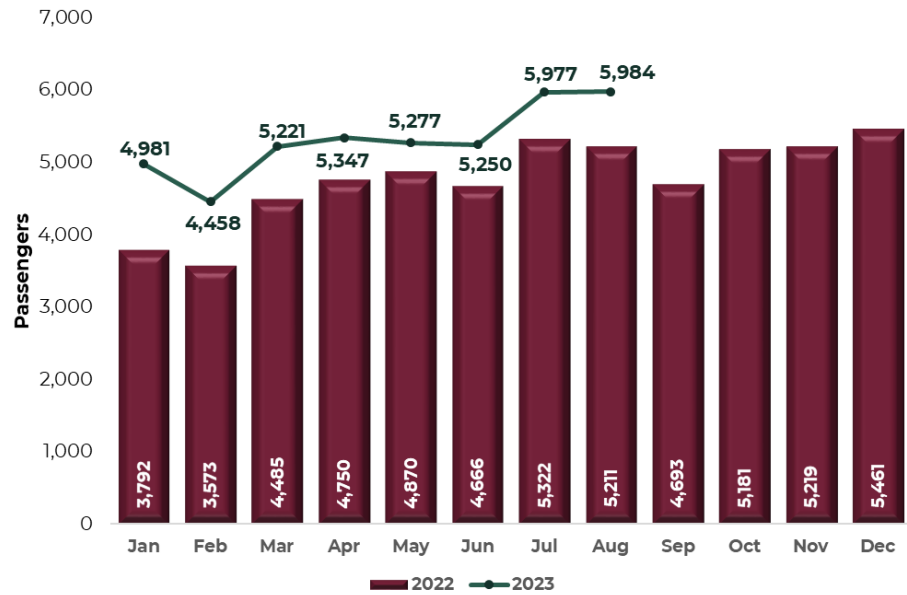

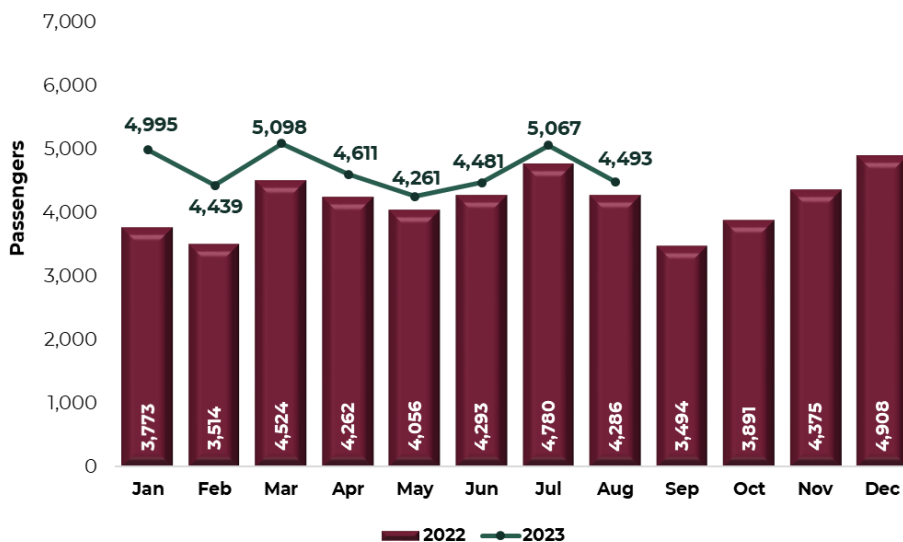

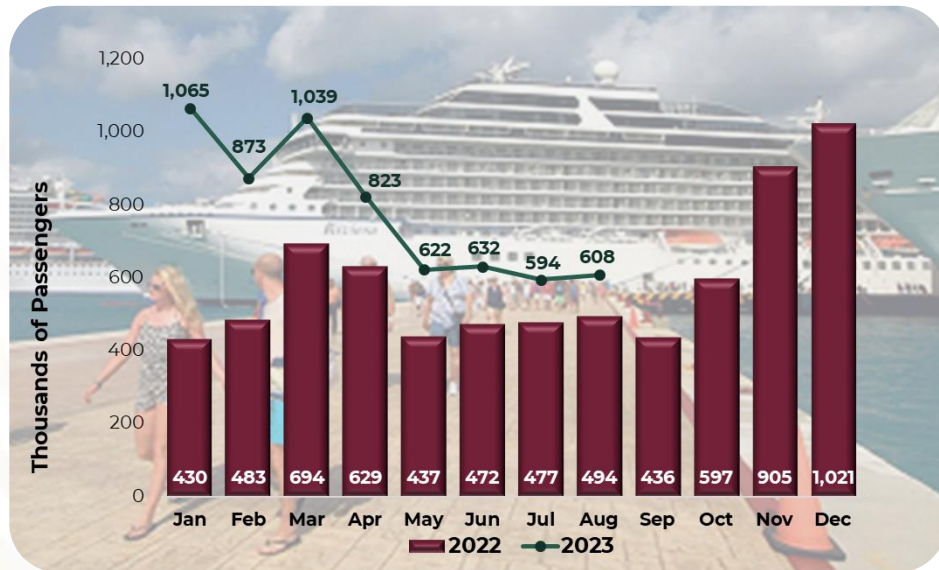

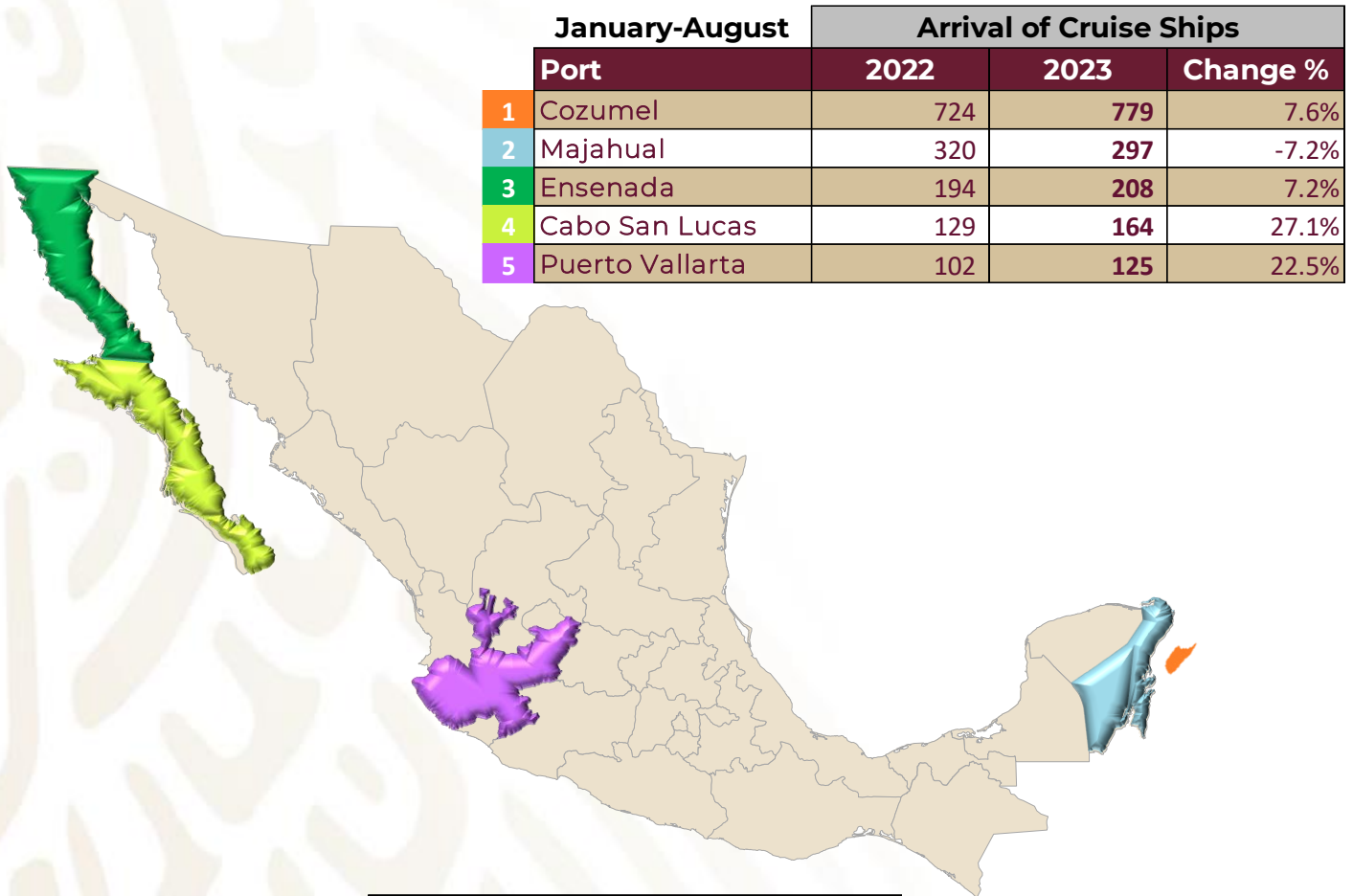

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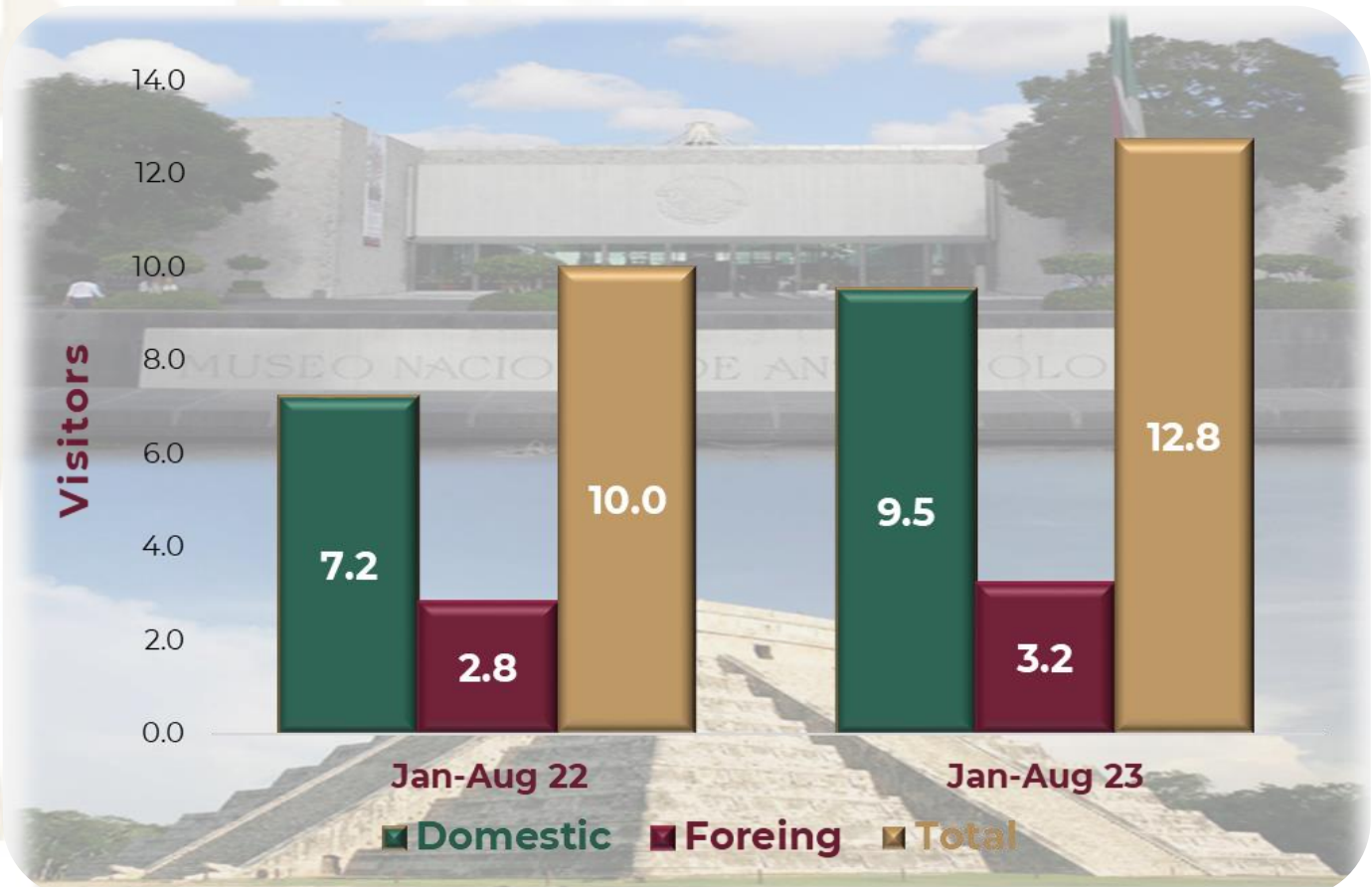




## Visitors to Museums and Archeological Sites

**Chart 24.** During January-August 2023, the National Institute of Anthropology and History reported the arrival of **12 million 756 thousand visitors** to museums and archaeological sites, that is, 2 million 729 thousand more visitors than reported in the same period of 2022, which represented an increase of **27.2%**. Of the total visitors, 74.6% were national visitors and 25.4% were international.

# OTHERS INDICATORS AND ANALYSIS OF INTERNATIONAL TOURISM





## Economic Context (Ministry of Finance)

### National

Domestic economic activity continued to exhibit resilience during the second quarter of 2023 and continued to expand in the third. Moving forward, there remains the risk of a weakening of economic activity given the complex external environment, although the expectation that domestic demand will continue to support domestic economic activity prevails. For its part, the sovereign credit rating maintains the investment grade with a stable outlook, although in recent months the one for Pemex has deteriorated in its 12-18 month outlook or in its rating

Overall, the Mexican financial system continues to show resilience and a solid position, largely backed by a commercial bank that has levels of capital and liquidity that far exceed regulatory minima. As for non-bank financial intermediaries, some institutions have faced difficulties in refinancing their debt in a context of restrictive financial conditions and risk aversion by investors. This sector maintains a small participation within the system, as well as a limited interconnection with the country's banks and other institutional investors, so that this situation does not represent a risk of potentially systemic scope.

### International

Global economic activity continued to recover during the third quarter of the year, even at a faster pace than anticipated a few months ago, albeit with heterogeneity among countries. While growth prospects for 2023 have recently improved, they have deteriorated by 2024.

While overall inflation continued to decline in most economies, it remains at high levels and, at the margin, rebounded in some advanced economies mainly as a result of energy price pressures. In this context, the central banks of some advanced economies continued to increase their reference rates. For its part, the Federal Reserve kept the federal funds rate unchanged at the September meeting, after it decided in July to increase it to a level of between 5.25 and 5.50 percent and is expected to maintain a restrictive stance for a longer period than previously anticipated.

In this environment, global risks to financial stability persist, highlighting the possibility that inflationary pressures may spread or become more pronounced. Against a background of strong levels of economic activity and employment in key economies, this could lead to an additional tightening of monetary policy globally. In addition, the recovery of the world economy could be delayed by a slowdown greater than anticipated in several large economies. In such an environment, the likelihood of abrupt adjustments in the prices of some financial assets resulting in volatility in tighter markets and financial conditions would increase. There is the possibility of systemic events affecting the global financial system, with implications for national markets.
