### National Tourist Price Index (NTPI) December 2024

**The National Tourist Price Index** is an economic indicator that monitors price fluctuations in representative tourist services in Mexico. Helps travelers, businesses and policymakers understand price trends in the tourism industry and impact on the national economy

### International Traveller Account Index December 2023

The International Traveller Account Indices cover both the income and the flow of people entering the country, with the objective of measuring the monthly and annual variations accumulated to make a detailed monitoring of international tourism activity.

Foreign Direct Investment in Tourism

The Foreign Direct Investment in Tourism registered in the fourth quarter of 2023, amounts to 304.5 million US dollars, equivalent to 35.3% of the Foreign Direct Investment collected in the country.

#### Nacional

In 2023, the Mexican economy exhibited a robust growth of 3.2%. The expansion in the year occurred in the context of a greater dissipation of some of the effects caused by the pandemic, the resilience of the United States economy and advances in various public infrastructure projects. This increase followed respective increases of 5.7 and 3.9% in 2021 and 2022. Throughout 2023, there were seasonal quarterly variations of 0.54, 0.81, 1.06 and 0.08% in each of the quarters, respectively. Thus, at the end of the year, the national economy presented a significant slowdown

Economic Context (Central Bank)

From a sectoral perspective, the lower dynamism of the Mexican economy towards the end of the year was the result of a weakening of the three main sectors of activity. In particular, secondary activities decreased 0.13% compared to the third quarter, while services exhibited a growth of 0.26%. This, after both aggregates showed high growth rates in the previous two quarters. Primary activities fell by 1.04%, but remained at high levels.

On the aggregate demand side, it is estimated that in the fourth quarter of 2023 the slowdown in economic activity compared to the previous quarters was the result of a moderation in the rate of growth of domestic spending, both public and private. Moreover, sluggish external demand would have persisted.

#### Internacional

During the fourth quarter of 2023, global economic activity expanded at a more moderate pace than in the previous quarter, although it remains resilient. Overall, growth was similar to that recorded in the third quarter for advanced economies and less dynamic for emerging economies, although heterogeneity in the dynamics of economic activity between countries continued.

The last quarter of the year saw a moderation in the US growth rate, although it was higher than expected and relatively dynamic. China registered lower growth than the previous quarter, while the euro area remained stagnant. For 2024 as a whole, forecasts by international agencies point to a similar growth in global economic activity relative to the estimated 2023 performance.

As for global inflation, in the fourth quarter of 2023, although overall inflation declined in most major economies, it remained above the targets of their respective central banks and in some cases, it rebounded in the last month of the year. Additionally, the underlying component continued to shrink gradually during the quarter. In this environment, risks to the global disinflationary process persist. In economies like the United States, this is primarily associated with the resilience of economic activity and the strength of the labor market, as well as the effects that could result from an escalation in geopolitical conflicts.
